FINANCE

REVENUE MANAGEMENT DIVISION BILLING RELATED ITEMS

Update on City of Pomona Delinquent Utility Account Late Fees / Disconnections

- Governor Newsom issued executive order N-08-21 on June 11, 2021, extending the prohibition of discontinuing water service until September 30, 2021. Staff has compared and confirmed that our current moratorium, approved by Council on May 17, 2021, and the outlined reinstatement of fees and water disconnections to ensure that it complies with the extension set by the Governor. The return to late fees and shutoff schedule presented to Council precludes shutoff to all customers' water before November 15, 2021. Staff will continue to monitor the State orders and will keep the City Council informed.
- Information regarding the moratorium, payment plans, and payment assistance programs are being marketed through email blasts, social media, bill inserts, and on customers billing statements.
- Finance recently implemented an additional outreach step that involves reviewing the daily billing batches and contacting all customers with a current delinquent balance over \$600 to discuss the balance and options available to them. On average, staff is reaching out to 30-60 customers per day. Over the past few weeks staff has established 9 payment plans and referred many more to Housingiskey.com for the payment assistance programs.
- Governor Newsom's 2021–22 May Revise to the state budget proposes that \$1 billion in American Rescue Plan Act funds be used to provide direct payments to water systems to address customer arrearages and revenue gaps related to the pandemic. Details of this program are still being worked out through the legislative budget process. The State Water Board will share additional details as they become available. Staff will continue to monitor this item and will keep the City Council informed.

Collections

During the Covid-19 pandemic, Departments citywide suspended the referral of delinquent accounts to collections. The Finance Department will work with all Departments to resume the referral of unpaid invoices, returned payments, and delinquent accounts to the collection agency effective July 1, 2021 (Contract approved at Council on 6/7/2021). Examples of some items that are regularly referred to the collections agency are unpaid business license accounts, delinquent closed utility accounts, unpaid library fees, unpaid invoices for misc. Accounts Receivable items, and

returned payments for Planning and Building permits. This collections process does not include active utility accounts.

Business License Penalties and Taxes

The Finance Department also waived penalties to businesses that were delinquent in paying their business license taxes due to Covid-19. The Finance Department processed penalty waivers to 84 businesses and have current payment arrangements with another 3 businesses. The Finance Department will suspend the waiver of penalties for delayed tax remittances due to Covid-19 effective July 1, 2021 but will continue offering payment plans to businesses for their business license tax balances to assist businesses still rebounding from reduced business due to Covid-19. Information about payment plan options will be included with business license renewal notices through September 30, 2021.



SPORT PARK TREE TRIMMING PROJECT

The Parks & Facilities Team has completed the Sport Park Tree Trimming Project. Work at these parks included the removal of dead and diseased trees, repairs to park facilities and lighting, and the raising of tree canopies up to 20 feet. The Team has completed seven parks, including Ralph Welch and Washington Parks. Ganesha Park is the next park on the schedule.

The removal and lifting of trees will allow better visibility for law enforcement to complete patrols, reducing crime and vandalism.



EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT PROGRAM

The FCC's Emergency Broadband Benefit will provide a discount of up to \$50 per month towards broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute \$10 to \$50 toward the purchase price. The Emergency Broadband Benefit is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household.
