## ***NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES***

### **DEVELOPMENT OF THE FY 2022-2023 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN**

The City of Pomona is in the process of developing its FY 2022-2023 Annual Action Plan. Annually, the City receives entitlement funding through the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the following programs: Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), Home Investment Partnership Program (HOME) and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG). The Plan will outline the amount of funding available and activities that may be undertaken to meet housing and community development needs.

As a condition of receipt of these funds, Staff is consulting with the following stakeholders to solicit their input on the City's needs:

- Community Residents
- Community Organizations Serving Residents
- Council Members
- Commissions
- Pomona Continuum of Care Organizations
- Pomona's Promise Group
- State and Local Health Agencies
- Public Housing Agencies

To ensure citizen and stakeholder participation in the development of the Action Plan, outreach efforts will include mailing informational postcards to over 44,000 households citywide, informing them of community meeting dates through various platforms, requesting their input via a Community Needs Survey and notification of Requests for Proposals (RFPs) for Community-Based Organizations (CBOs) to assist in providing services to residents. ## **HAUNTED HOUSE – A FUN AND SCARY SUCCESS!**

The Community Services Division proudly hosted the 6th Annual Haunted House at Palomares Park on October 29<sup>th</sup> and October 30<sup>th</sup>. This event saw its largest crowd with approximately 1,300 – 1,500 people attending between the two nights, and with 1,184 people preregistering. To ensure a safe celebration, COVID-19 protocols were followed, making masks, hand sanitizer, and sanitizing wipes available during registration and at each game booth. The success of the event was largely due to banners, signage, and social media presence.

The City would like to thank its community partners, 48 volunteers, and the 50+ City staff who came together to provide a safe and festive family-friendly event. A special recognition to Cal Poly Pomona’s Kellogg Honors College, Day One, Pomona Unified School District, Pomona Connect, Village Academy, Project Horseshoe Farm, the City’s Public Works Department, and City Commissioners who volunteered in the family-friendly area.

The City strives to improve and increase community impact and outreach through strengthening collaborative partnerships, increasing City Department involvement, and identifying funding sponsors to continue making the City’s Haunted House an attractive and memorable free annual community event.

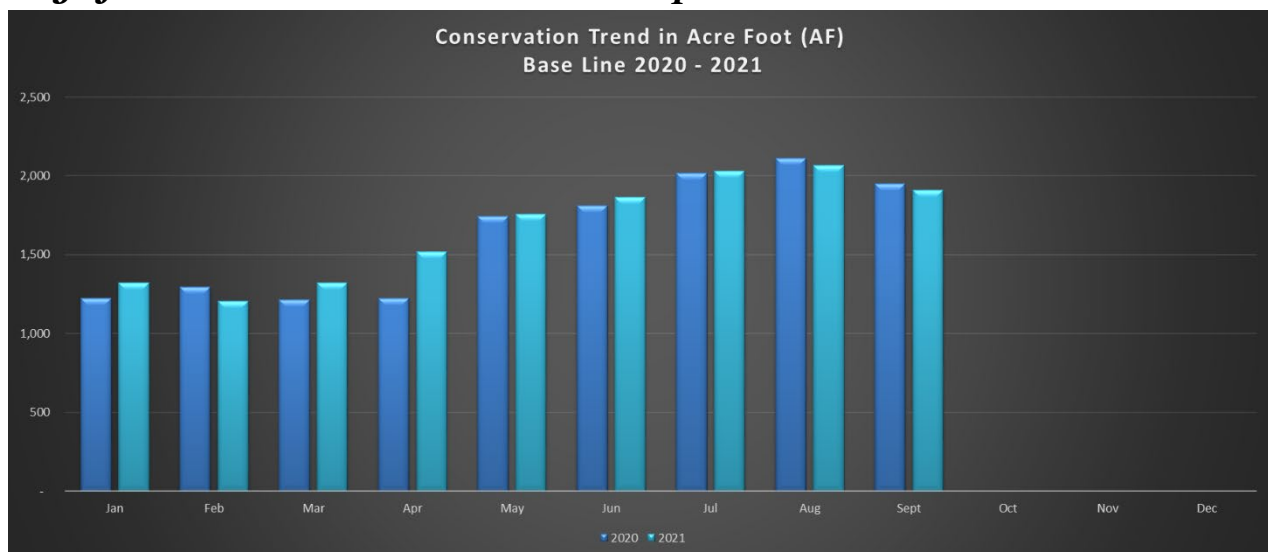

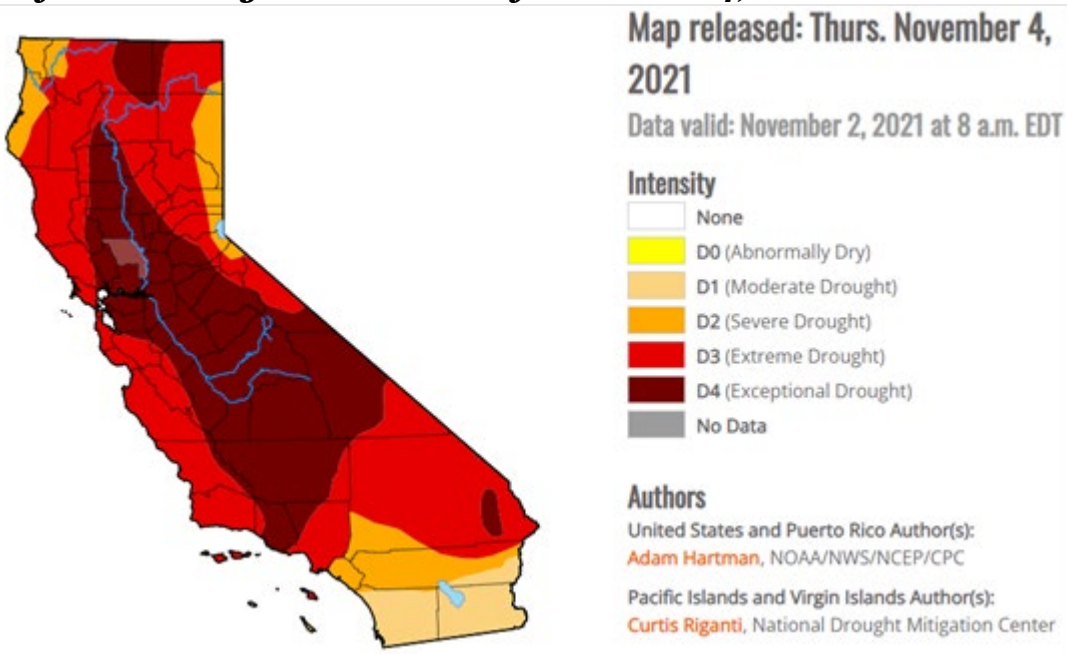
### **2021 DROUGHT UPDATE – GOVERNOR NEWSOM DECLARED A DROUGHT EMERGENCY**

On October 19, 2021, Governor Newsom declared a drought emergency and asked for all Californians to reduce their water use by 15% from our 2020 levels, as severe conditions threaten our water resources throughout the state, and across the southwest. Unfortunately, we do not know how long this drought will last, so we must unite and reduce our water use to preserve valuable water reserves. We know what to do in a drought, as we all came together to reduce our water use in the last drought in 2015. The graph below compares the 2020 levels to 2021 levels per the Governor’s declaration. We need to work together, so let’s do our part to conserve!

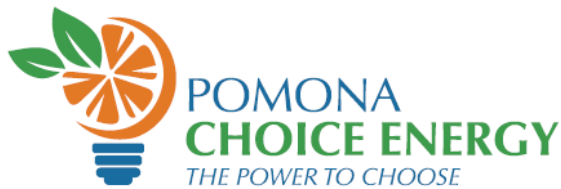

### **CITY OF POMONA FALL/WINTER WATERING SCHEDULE**

On November 1<sup>st</sup>, the water schedule changed to one day a week from two days. Let's do our part to conserve 15 percent. Pomona has teamed up with Metropolitan Water District to offer water conservation tips and rebates. The rebates can be located at [www.bewaterwise.com](http://www.bewaterwise.com).

Pomona is currently at a Level 1 Water Supply Shortage, which limits watering days, requires all leaks to be repaired within 72 hours, and for customers to continue with the permanent water conservation restrictions. A full list of restrictions can be found on the [website](#).

### **EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT PROGRAM**

The [FCC's Emergency Broadband Benefit](#) will provide a discount of up to \$50 per month towards broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute \$10 to \$50 toward the purchase price. The Emergency Broadband Benefit is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household.
