## ***PUBLIC WORKS***

### **PARKS AND FACILITIES MASTER PLAN – GET INVOLVED!**

The City of Pomona received a \$250,000 grant from the County of Los Angeles Measure A Program for the creation of the Parks and Facilities Master Plan. This plan will guide current and future park and recreation development based on community-wide input. It will include recommendations for upgrading, expanding, or renovating existing parks and recreation facilities, as well as evaluating recreation and programming needs. There are several ways you can get involved.

### **SENATE BILL 1383 (SB 1383)**

Starting January 1, 2022, California State law, SB 1383, requires all residents, multi-family complexes, and businesses to recycle organic materials (i.e., food waste and green waste.) The new requirements are part of a statewide effort to reduce harmful methane emissions. Recycling organic waste is a small change with big environmental benefits. Composting food scraps and green waste together reduces the amount of waste taken to landfills, thereby reducing a significant methane emissions source.

You may participate in this program and reduce your amount of food waste going to landfills by:

1. Place your food waste in compostable bags, and
2. Then, place those bags of food waste in your green waste cans.

When the compostable bags arrive at the transfer station, the food waste will be diverted to composting facilities. Compostable bags can be found at most grocery stores, in either the paper goods aisle or the trash bag aisle, and at Target, Walmart, and Amazon. By participating in this statewide program, you are helping to do your part to reduce harmful methane emissions and improve the environment.



### **TRAFFIC SIGNAL POLE REPLACEMENT ON SAN ANTONIO AVE. AND MISSION BLVD.**

During the recent windstorm event, a traffic signal pole at the southeast corner of Mission Blvd. and San Antonio Ave was severely damaged. To bring the signalized intersection back to normal operation, a new foundation must be constructed for a new signal pole and mast arm. This repair is anticipated to take approximately two weeks to complete. While repairs are underway, the signalized intersection will remain in “flashing red” mode. The City of Pomona asks drivers for their continued patience and to consider using alternate routes during this time.



## **CONTINUED TRAFFIC SIGNAL POLE REPAIR AT TOWNE AVE AND BONITA AVE**

Pomona City Staff continues work to replace the traffic signal pole, foundation, and all necessary hardware associated with the full operation at the northeast corner of Towne Ave and Bonita Ave, which was damaged by a vehicle crash. The City asks drivers to use an alternate route in their travels while that intersection is undergoing repairs. Traffic at this location will be heavier than usual from February 2, 2022 to February 16, 2022



## **OPERATION “OWL HABITAT”**

The Parks and Facilities Division is thinking “OWL-SIDE” the box! In an effort to reduce the gopher population in our parks and sports fields, we have installed Barn Owl boxes to attract Barn Owls, which help to control the gopher population naturally.

Natural predators such as hawks, eagles, owls, and various other birds of prey help naturally maintain rodent populations, at night, without using chemicals. Installing the “Barn Owl Boxes” is a practice that has been sustainable in large areas for centuries. We are excited to see our new “employees” hard at work!

If you see the Owl boxes occupied, please leave them alone and marvel at the great work that they will do to help keep our park’s gopher population under control.



## **CITY COUCIL DECLARES STATE OF EMERGENCY-ROLL-OFF CONTAINERS AVAILABLE FOR STORM-RELATED DEBRIS**

Over the weekend, on January 22-23, 2022, the City of Pomona experienced a strong windstorm event resulting in hundreds of downed trees, limbs, power lines, and miscellaneous debris/damage. At the Mayor's direction, the Public Works Department



has provided residents with four 40-yard roll-off containers at three locations. The containers are placed in the City's Northeast quadrant, the areas hardest hit are:

- Palomares Park (2)
- Ted Greene Park (1)
- Lincoln Park (1)

Residents are welcome to help clean up their property of storm debris, including palm fronds, by using these containers. Please note that these containers are for **green waste only**.

## **CITY COUCIL DECLARES STATE OF EMERGENCY - MAJOR WIND STORM DAMAGE**

As a result of the strong windstorm event on January 22-23, 2022, hundreds of calls came in to Police Dispatch, the Parks and Facilities' City tree reporting line (909-620-3759), and various offices throughout the City reporting downed trees, limbs, power lines, and miscellaneous debris/damage.

City staff and all contractors, including West Coast Arborists, Merchants Landscape Services, Inc., and MCE, continue to work diligently on the hundreds of work orders generated. The Parks and Facilities Division is prioritizing calls in the following order per City protocol:

Priorities for Tree Emergencies-Coordinated with Police, Fire, on-call staff, and contractors:

1. Trees that fall on power lines/homes (LA County Fire responds)
2. Blocked rights-of-way/main thoroughfares road clearance – for Emergency Access (clear blocked access)
3. School street access
4. Medians with downed trees/debris

5. Parks
6. Residential arterials (not blocking streets)

Private trees that fall are the responsibility of the homeowner. The City will only clear the tree if it meets the Priority for Emergencies listed above and will leave debris for the homeowner to remove.

Residents, when calling in a downed tree, shall provide the following information:

1. Accurate location
2. Is there a power line down? Call 911 immediately.
3. Any persons hit or trapped by a tree? Call 911 immediately.
4. City tree or private tree?
5. Is the tree blocking the roadway/street?
6. Is any part of the tree hanging, which may fall or cause further damage?

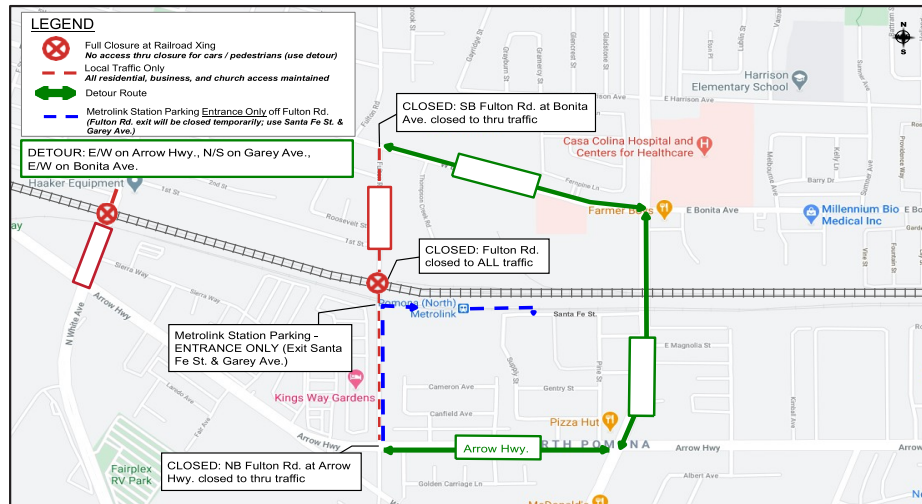

### **FULL STREET CLOSURE – FULTON RD. AT RAILROAD CROSSING**

As part of the 9.1- mile Foothill Gold Line light rail project, starting Monday, February 7 and continuing thru Friday, February 11, 2022, Fulton Rd. will be fully closed to all traffic (vehicular and pedestrian) at the railroad crossing 24 hours a day. Arrow Hwy. (south of the crossing) and Bonita Ave. (north of the crossing) will remain open and accessible by way of detour routes, see map below. In addition, the Metrolink Station driveway on Fulton Rd. will be restricted to entrance only during the closure; vehicles will need to exit at Santa Fe St. to Garey Ave.

- Daily Work Hours: 6:00 AM - 11:00 PM. Overnight work and Sunday shifts may also be required.

### **EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT PROGRAM**

The [FCC's Emergency Broadband Benefit](#) (The Affordable Connectivity Program replaced the Emergency Broadband Benefit on December 31, 2021) will provide a discount of up to \$30 per month towards broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for

households on Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute \$10 to \$50 toward the purchase price. The Emergency Broadband Benefit is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household.
