Our suite of programs are here to help you save energy and lead your community on the path to sustainable energy.

Project Delivery Program Guides public agencies from start to finish through energy efficiency projects. Services include audit and technical services, financial analysis and financing support, procurement support, and utility incentive application support.

Metered Savings Program A new way to access SoCalREN's Project Delivery Program support, this program uses normalized metered energy consumption (NMEC) to measure energy savings at the meter, unlocking new project opportunities to go beyond utility incentive eligible measures.

Revolving Savings Fund Provides upfront construction financing for small to midsize projects at 0% interest. Can be used to bridge the delay between construction and On-Bill Financing (OBF) or other sources of funds not immediately available.

Pathway to Zero Offered in conjunction with our energy efficiency programs, Pathway to Zero provides a comprehensive view of energy opportunities for facilities in disadvantaged communities, including energy efficiency and Distributed Energy Resources like demand response, electric vehicle charging infrastructure, and photovoltaic systems with battery storage.
