

eSGV is a program that provides San Gabriel Valley residents with FREE home energy efficiency assessments, helping them identify opportunities that may reduce household energy usage and costs.

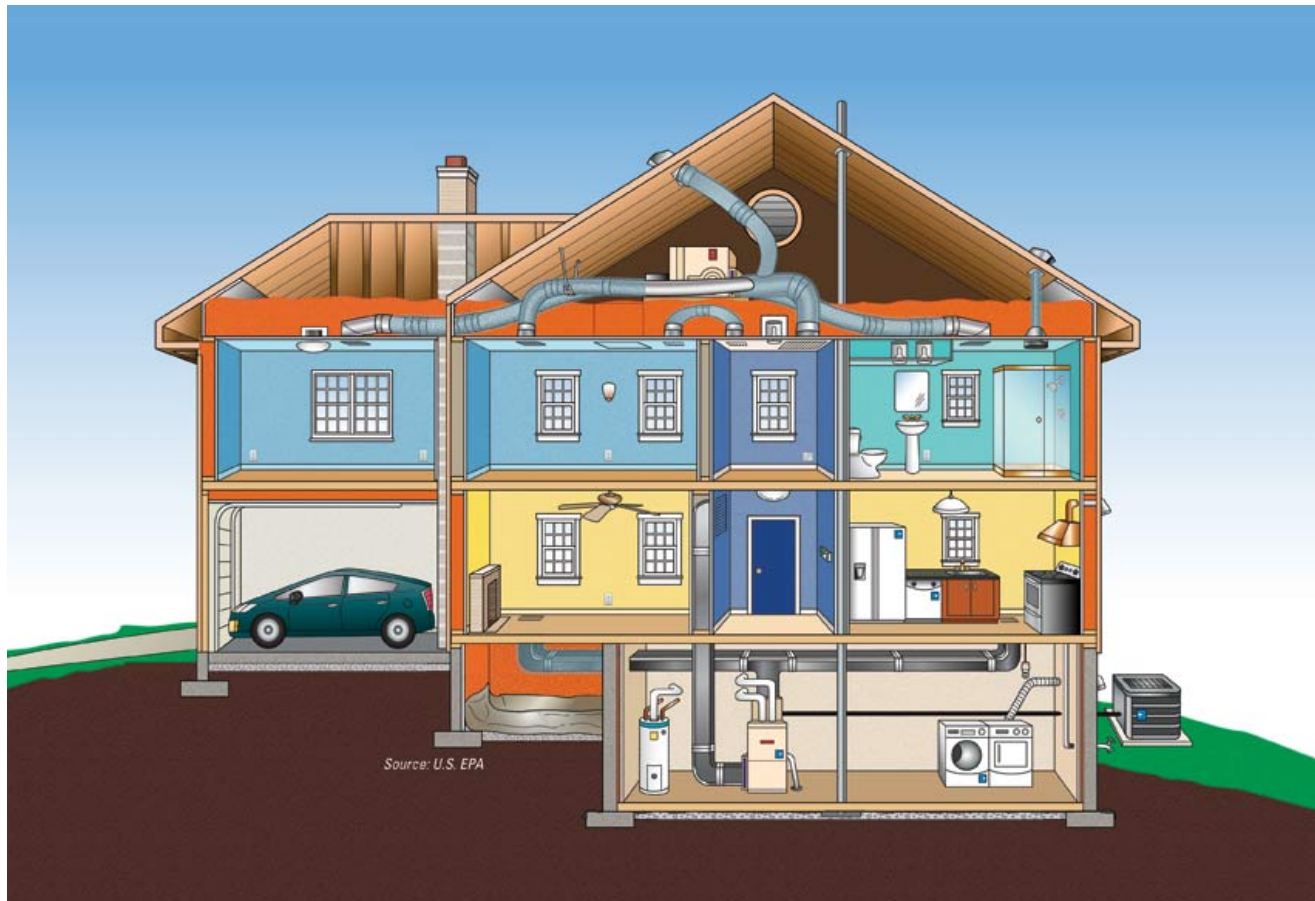

eSGV home energy efficiency assessments utilize the "whole house" approach. This means we'll assess every aspect of your home that contributes to energy consumption and efficiency. From building materials and water usage to lighting and appliances, we'll provide guidance on how to make your home more energy efficient.

About the San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments (SGVCOG)
