COMMUNITY SERVICES

STAY COOL, STAY HYDRATED, STAY INFORMED

During very warm weather, the City takes measures to ensure the safety of its residents. A City staff member monitors the National Weather Services and assists in activating the "cooling centers" at the City. This information is then communicated to key City staff and posted on social media.

When the temperature reaches 95 degrees or higher, City outdoor recreational programming and activities are cancelled. Similarly, games at Veterans Park Soccer Complex will not operate. Field renters are typically offered later start times, during cooler temperatures. However, there has not been a significant temperature drop in the

evenings to accommodate players. Soccer fields with synthetic turf absorb heat and can feel 10-15 degrees hotter, induce dehydration, or cause heat-related illness.

Stay cool, drink plenty of fluids, and monitor the City website and social media for cooling center availability.

SENIORS RECEIVE VOUCHERS FOR FRESH PRODUCE

The Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP) is a federally funded program administered by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food and Nutrition Services Agency. The goal of SFMNP is to provide fresh, nutritious, unprepared, locally-grown produce to low-income seniors 60+ that meet income criteria provided by the County. During the weeks of August 22 and August 29, 2022, 50 seniors at Washington Park and 70 seniors at Palomares Park received a \$50 voucher to be used at local farmers markets.

DISPATCHERS MEET WITH STUDENTS FROM WASHINGTON ELEMENTARY

On August 31st, Dispatcher Camille Marks and Dispatch Manager Kendra Farmer visited Washington Elementary School to create a safety video interview. The students conducted an on-camera interview with Camille who was able to share “What to do when you call 9-1-1?” tips and answer questions. The video was played in each classroom on Friday morning and shared with all of their students. Students learned what information to provide to a dispatcher when calling 9-1-1 during an emergency, to first seek safety before calling and to get an adult if at all possible. It is important to build the relationships between dispatchers and students so they feel comfortable calling for help when in need as it helps remove the fear of calling. This was fun for everyone involved.

WATER RESOURCES

NO OUTDOOR WATERING - UPPER FEEDER SHUTDOWN THROUGH SEPT. 20

Effective September 6th, residents and businesses are being asked to suspend outdoor watering for 15 days as a critical imported water pipeline will be shut down for emergency repairs.

The Metropolitan Water District, joined by its member agencies and local retail water agencies has sent out a water-saving call to stretch Southern California's severely limited water supplies as Metropolitan repairs this pipeline.

The 36-mile upper feeder pipeline is an important part of Metropolitan's regional water system delivering Colorado River water into Southern California. After a leak was discovered in the pipeline earlier this year, Metropolitan made a temporary repair and began operating the pipeline at a reduced capacity while a more permanent solution was designed and developed. The repair will be performed from September 6-20, during which the pipeline will be shut down.
