PUBLIC WORKS

OVERNIGHT FULL CLOSURE OF NORTH AND SOUTHBOUND SR-71

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) has announced a full freeway closure of the Northbound and Southbound lanes of State Route 71 (SR-71) from the SR-71/SR-60 Interchange to Mission Boulevard on Monday, October 3, 2022. The overnight closure is for the removal of an overhead sign structure. The scheduled closure is part of the SR-71 Expressway-to-Freeway Conversion project.

Closures are as follows:

Monday, October 3 at 10:00 p.m. through Tuesday, October 4, 2022 at 6:00 a.m.

- North and Southbound SR-71 from the SR-71/SR-60 Interchange to Mission Boulevard.
- Mission Boulevard & Rio Rancho Road on-ramps will be CLOSED at 7:00 p.m.

Residents and businesses located near the freeway are advised to anticipate noise, vibrations, and dust associated with construction activities. Detours will be posted for motorist convenience.

Motorists should expect delays and are strongly advised to avoid the area and use alternate routes. Additionally, motorists can check traffic conditions before they leave by visiting the Caltrans Quickmap (quickmap.dot.ca.gov).

Caltrans reminds motorists to “Be Work Zone Alert” and “Slow for the Cone Zone.”

This schedule is weather permitting; all dates and times are subject to change.

MISSION BOULEVARD PROJECT (and Philadelphia St. & Buena Vista Ave.)

You may have experienced some recent traffic slow-downs during the last several weeks along Mission Boulevard as the City’s Contractor, All American Asphalt (AAA), was preparing for re-paving of the asphalt portion of this important route in our City. Please continue to drive slowly through this area for about the next month or so while this construction work is completed, and please do likewise for all construction zones anytime you may encounter one. Construction workers, Public Works Inspectors, and Street Engineers all have families that like to see them come home every day safe and sound.

AAA first worked on sidewalk, curb & gutter, curb ramps, and other concrete repairs along Mission Boulevard. Next, they used grinding equipment to mill off the surface of the street between most of the main intersections between White Avenue and Towne Avenue., first West of Garey Avenue and then East of Garey Avenue. Subsequently, AAA continued grinding and quickly repaving the base asphalt in these areas.

Traffic volumes and turning movements on Mission Boulevard, at White Avenue, Garey Avenue, Towne Avenue and a few of the other signalized intersections, as well as several other factors (under-drains, etc.) further complicate the work at these intersection locations. Therefore, AAA has intentionally skipped over these intersections for important safety reasons. However, they will soon be returning to these intersections to grind and repave them as part of this project.

You may notice a difference between the color and texture of the finished pavement at the above intersections compared to the portions of finished pavement on Mission Boulevard between these intersections. This is also by design. Since the above-mentioned underdrains are very shallow and mostly at intersections, a conventional asphalt mix containing fine gravel needs to be used at the intersections where it can be spread in a thinner layer over the shallow underdrains. Use of conventional asphalt at the intersections also helps create a thicker section of pavement (where possible in the intersections), while at the same time reducing the amount of time needed for repaving the intersections (compared to the time needed when using other types of pavement). The portions of Mission between intersections will use rubberized asphalt (ARHM), which helps to recycle used tires that it contains.

For safety reasons, and to help manage traffic delays during construction, some of the above work will be completed on the weekend (typically some Saturdays) if it is not possible to complete all of particular segments during a work week. Please note that a layer of special rubberized asphalt (Asphalt Rubberized Aggregate Membrane, ARAM) with fine broken rock ('screenings') is also being used on this project to help manage construction costs and design life of this street repaving – while working with the remaining underlying materials. When the ARAM with screenings layer is placed it needs to be worked into place for about one (1) week by vehicles traveling on it before the final layer of ARHM can be placed between intersections. During the week-long ARAM inter-layer placement process, there will be some dust and traffic delays that are unavoidable. Please continue to have patience while the City and AAA complete this project, and the work is expected to be complete by November 2022.

This project also includes similar work intended to be complete during 2022 on:

- Philadelphia Street from San Antonio Avenue to Reservoir Street, and
- Buena Vista Avenue from Mission Boulevard to Ninth Street.
