#### INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

#### COMING TO A COMMUNITY CENTER NEAR YOU

On January 23, 2023, the City Council unanimously voted to appropriate some CDBG funds to install high-speed internet at City community centers. IT will be working closely with the Neighborhood Services Department to identify each community center's needs and purchase the appropriate equipment.

For the past several months, the IT Department worked diligently to secure high-speed internet for our community centers. With Staff's persistence to overcome obstacles,

Kennedy, Kiwanis, Philadelphia, and Ralph Welch Community Centers now have high-speed internet; Garfield Community Center is next. While high-speed internet already exists for Palomares, Renacimiento, Washington, and Westmont Community Centers, all community centers, including recent additions, require the purchase and installation of new equipment to offer community members free Wi-Fi. IT will be focusing on this initiative next.


For the remaining community centers where cost-effective high-speed internet is not available including Ganesha, Jaycee, and Willie White, IT will explore and test multi-cellular aggregation technology instead of the traditional hardwired broadband.

### NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES

#### **HOMELESS COUNT**

The 2023 Los Angeles Point-in-Time Count (the Homeless Count) for the City of Pomona deployment site was conducted on January 24<sup>th</sup>. The primary purpose of the Homeless Count is to measure the prevalence of unhoused people living in unsheltered locations (sleeping outdoors, streets, parks, or vehicles, etc.). The Homeless Count entailed over 60 volunteers canvassing the City after sunset. The participation of community members, college students, partner agencies, and City Staff was fundamental in collecting meaningful data needed to push for a fair share of federal resources required to support homeless programs in Pomona.

A special acknowledgment to the volunteers for their time and commitment to ensure the Homeless Count was successful, Mayor Tim Sandoval, Councilmember Victor Preciado, the Quality of Life Team for accompanying the Special Counts Team, and Officer Billy Dinh for ensuring everyone's safety. Through the efforts of the Special Counts Team, 11 referrals were made to beds reserved at the Hope for Home Homeless Services Center. The Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA) will publish the results of the Homeless Count in late summer to early fall of this year.

#### UNDERCOVER OPERATION RESULTS IN SIX ARRESTS

On Wednesday, January 26<sup>th</sup> members from the Pomona Police Department Sexual Exploitation and Trafficking Team (SETT), the Special Investigations Unit (SIU) and the Major Crimes Task Force (MCTF) conducted an undercover operation targeting sex purchasers and human traffickers. Undercover officers were deployed within the East Holt corridor and subsequently contacted numerous sex purchasers. During the operation, five men were arrested for soliciting sex acts from the undercover officers.

Also during the operation, an individual accosted the undercover officers and began to recruit them as sex workers under his guidance. Through this individual's engagement with the undercover officers, it was clear he was attempting to entice them further into the lifestyle and traffic them for profit. This individual was also arrested and is now facing Human Trafficking charges. The City of Pomona and the Police Department take a firm stance against human trafficking and will continue efforts to rescue victims and hold sex purchasers accountable.


#### SUPPORT PROVIDED FOR MONTEREY PARK POLICE AND FIRE DEPT.

# **PUBLIC WORKS**

## FULL STREET CLOSURE - GAREY AVE. AT RAILROAD CROSSING

As part of the 9.1-mile Foothill Gold Line Project, the contractor and crews will be fully rebuilding the railroad crossing for the new light rail system on Garey Avenue in the City of Pomona. This will result in a full closure of Garey Avenue at the railroad crossing for

approximately 45 days. The full closure will begin on Wednesday, February 1, 2023, and extend through Friday, March 17, 2023. The contractor may also work Sundays or overnight, if necessary.

Access to homes and businesses on Garey Avenue within the closure area north and south of the railroad crossing will be maintained at all times, as well as, access to the Metrolink station from Arrow Highway and Fulton Road or Pine Street. Residents and businesses near the Garey Avenue rail crossing are advised to anticipate construction noise.

Detour routes (green arrows shown on the map below) will be in place during the closure, and signage will be posted to direct motorists, pedestrians, and Metrolink customers. Please follow the detour signs.

# **Detour Routes (Green Arrows seen on the map below):**

- Towne Avenue (northbound and southbound) will serve as the main detour
- Arrow Highway (eastbound and westbound) will remain open to traffic
- Bonita Avenue (eastbound to westbound) will remain open to traffic




# LOS ANGELES COUNTY METRO AND THE ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM GRANT AWARD

The City is excited to announce that it has been awarded an \$11.3M grant from Los Angeles County Metro through the Active Transportation Program (ATP) Cycle 6. The ATP Cycle 6 is a biannual competitive funding opportunity for projects that encourage increased bicycling and walking. The grant will be used to construct the long awaited San Jose Creek Multi-Use Bikeway (SJC Bikeway) Project. The SJC Bikeway will be a 3.5-mile long bicycle and walking trail along the San Jose Creek from Temple Avenue to Murchison Avenue. It will provide connectivity for students, residents, and visitors to local schools, parks, the Fairplex, and Cal Poly Pomona. This bikeway will include possible art amenities, mosaics, and/or murals along the path. In addition, SJC Bikeway will have some educational features that would potentially showcase the City's

intention for sustainability. The City is presently working on the design of the project with ALTA Planning and Design. Construction of the SJC Bikeway is anticipated to be completed by 2026.

#### PUBLIC WORKS FRONT COUNTER CLOSURE

The City of Pomona's Public Works Department is committed to improving their methods in working more effectively and efficiently in assisting customers at the front counter at City Hall. In that effort, the Public Works front desk personnel will undergo training on Thursday, February 2, 2023, from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. to gain additional knowledge to better serve the public. During this time, the Public Works counter will be closed temporarily.

# WATER RESOURCES

#### WATER RESOURCES DEPARTMENT BANNERS

The Water Resources Department has added new water conservation banners throughout the City. One banner will remind residents to conserve water, and another will display the City's Level 2 water schedule. This Level 2 Water Supply Shortage response requires residents to limit watering to one day per week, November through March, with odd addresses on Thursday and even addresses on Tuesday. Department crews will move these banners around the City between various wells and reservoir sites every few months. In addition, two banners will be displayed in front of Palomares Park.

We remind our customers to fix leaks, breaks, or malfunctions within 48 hours of notification by the City. No refilling of ornamental lakes or ponds unless necessary for existing aquatic life. Wash vehicles only at a car wash with a recirculating system or by bucket and shut-off nozzle. Report water waste by calling our Water Watcher 24-Hour Reporting Line at 909-620-2244.
