### **COMMUNITY CENTER INTERNET UPDATE**

As a follow-up to our update from a January City Manager's Weekly Report, IT recently signed an agreement with a carrier to bring in cost-effective high-speed internet to the Garfield Community Center. IT is collaborating with a reputable vendor who will loan out a dual SIM cellular router that is expected to offer speeds comparable to 100Mbps for other parks. IT will test the equipment at Ganesha, Jaycee, and Willie White Community Centers to determine if it is a viable alternative to traditional hardwired internet. Additionally, IT is assessing quotes for procuring the necessary network

equipment to offer community members free Wi-Fi at various community centers. Stay tuned!

## **PUBLIC WORKS** **REPORTING POTHOLES**

Due to recent significant storm events, City streets have sustained considerable damage in the form of potholes. Typically, after a storm, four, two-man crews are dispatched to expedite the repair process. The process involves a truck known as a P.B. Patcher.

Pothole repairs are conducted, as follows:

1. All of the existing asphalt that has crumbled into the pothole is removed and the edges are cleaned.
2. Tack oil, the adhesive that bonds the existing asphalt to the new asphalt, is applied.
3. Asphalt is then added and is compacted with a tamper. This process, though very repetitive, requires using extreme care of the surroundings.



The Public Services Division has implemented a very efficient method in conducting Pothole Repairs, as follows:

- Regular monitoring of Arterial and Collector Streets,
- Generate Service Requests from Public via Reporting line, [PomonaGo](#), and City Website,
- Pothole Hotspots

Below is the January-December 2022 and January-February 2023 street maintenance information on the number of locations responded to, the number of potholes filled, and the square footage of asphalt used to fill potholes:

### January – December 2022

- Staff responded to 1,047 locations
- Repaired 8,868 potholes
- 52,782 sq. ft. of asphalt

## January –February 2023

- Staff responded to 184 locations repairing:
- Repaired 2,165 potholes
- 6,714 sq. ft. of asphalt

## **DISTRUBITION OF SANDBAGS TO CITY RESIDENTS**

Due to the forecasted storm this weekend, the Public Works Department will provide sandbags for the purpose of protecting properties from possible flooding. Each resident is allowed a 20-sandbag maximum per residence. Residents can pick up sandbags at the Monterey Yard located at 636 West Monterey. Streets Division personnel will be available to assist on Friday, March 10<sup>th</sup>, from 6:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.; after hour requests can be made by contacting the Pomona Police Department non-emergency telephone number at (909) 622-1241; Staff will meet residents at the Monterey Yard. ## **SOCALGAS ANNOUNCES \$10 MILLION TO SUPPORT LOW-INCOME FAMILIES, SENIORS AND SMALL RESTAURANT OWNERS IMPACTED BY GAS MARKET PRICES**

On February 27, 2023, Southern California Edison (SoCalGas) announced \$10 million in shareholder funding to help customers with bill assistance and to bolster community resources for those who may be struggling financially.

The company committed \$5 million in shareholder funding to the Gas Assistance Fund, a program administered by United Way that provides income-qualified customers with one-time grants to help pay their natural gas bills. The contribution is the largest in the fund's 40-year history and will help United Way expand access to the program to thousands of additional Southern Californians this winter.

SoCalGas also announced it will contribute \$4 million from its donor advised fund to relaunch its popular Fueling Our Communities program, a collaboration with local food banks and nonprofits that has provided free meals and groceries to thousands of Californians facing food insecurity since 2020.

In addition, SoCalGas will contribute \$1 million in aid from its donor advised fund to small restaurant owners through the Restaurants Care Resilience Fund, a fund that was started in 2021 to help small restaurants with improvements, upgrades, employee retention and to manage debt, losses and rising costs.
