2023 CALIFORNIA PARKS & RECREATION SOCIETY CONFERENCE & EXPO

During the week of April 3-6, 2023, City staff (six from Community Services and five from Public Works) attended the 2023 CPRS Conference and Expo. Five Recreation

staff also attended a one-day intensive session. The Conference convened approximately 1,500 Park & Recreation professionals from throughout the state and is known for its innovative educational sessions, forums, and networking opportunities, while the Expo brings together hundreds of industry-leading vendors and exhibitors. In all, City staff attended 40+ educational sessions such as:

Staff participated in the Parks Make Life Better! 2023 MODEL UNITED NATIONS

Community Services is partnering with the YMCA of Orange County to create future leaders through the Model United Nations (MUN) program. Pomona youth in grades 6th – 8th and ages 12-14, had the opportunity to participate in Pomona's local chapter for MUN. As a part of the program, participants were able to attend UCLA's Geffen Academy SoCal one-day training on March 25, 2023 where delegates met students from other parts of Southern California. Students worked in groups and each group was assigned their own country. Students were excited to network and meet participants and advisors who had worked with Model UN in the past. Delegates also participated in mock trials and had a great time discussing points that affect different areas of our country. Each week, there will be delegate meeting at Kennedy Park from 5:00 – 6:00 p.m. The next conference will be held May 19-21, 2023 at a camp in Running Springs and will wrap up Model UN activities for this session. INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

HARDWARE REFRESH

For the past couple of weeks, the IT Department dedicated much of its resources on hardware refresh efforts by replacing computers that are five years and older. We are on track to deploy 50+ computers to various departments by the end of this week. Besides general hardware replacement, IT is also taking the opportunity to assess staff's needs to ensure proper equipment are issued for optimal efficiency while still being fiscally responsible. Equipment considerations include hardware type such as desktops, laptops, tablets, and rugged devices, as well as hardware specs within the computing device.

ON A S-WITCH HUNT!

Back in January, IT Department kicked off an effort to modernize our network infrastructure by replacing 28 switches. As of this week, we have replaced 13 of the 28 switches and on track to replace the remaining switches in the fall. This modernization effort will benefit the City of Pomona by strengthening our cybersecurity posture and improve overall network performance.

SPOOF PROOF

The City of Pomona's IT Department will modernize digital business practices by requiring organizations that exchange e-mails with the City to have Sender Policy

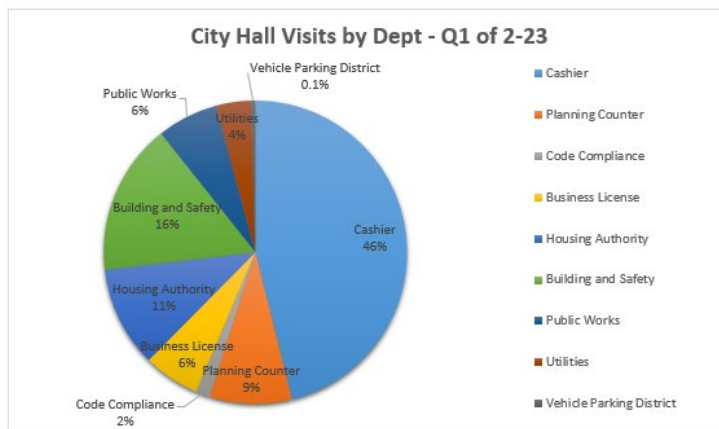
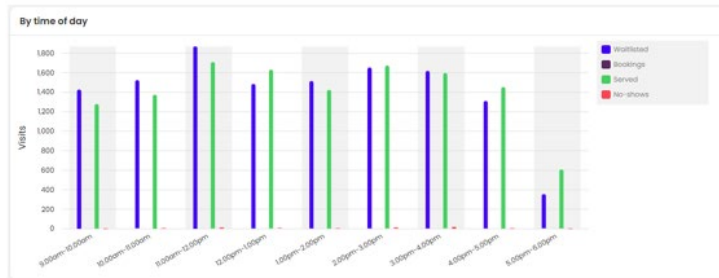
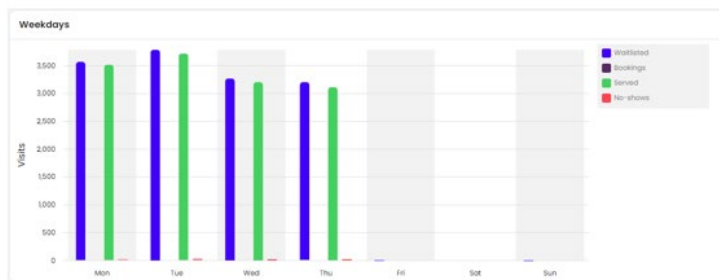
Framework (SPF) configured in their Domain Name System (DNS). An organization's SPF record identifies specifically what IP address(es) are allowed to send e-mails on their behalf, this cybersecurity hygiene is then up to the e-mail recipient server to reference and enforce. When e-mails originate outside of specified IP address range, it is an indicator that the e-mail was spoofed or impersonated by a malicious actor and will be blocked consequently.

To minimize business disruption, IT will routinely monitor blocked e-mail traffic and engage e-mail recipients and/or sender organizations as needed.

Artist's Design Intent:

"The goal of this proposed mural is to represent the early history of the City of Pomona. Named after the ancient Roman Goddess of Fruit, before its incorporation in 1888 the area wasn't yet known for fruit trees. With access to Coachella valley water and the expanding railroad system Pomona would later become referred to as "Queen of the Citrus Belt."

SHRED-A-THON & PRESCRIPTION DRUG TAKE BACK EVENT

The Pomona Police Department will be hosting a free [Shred-A-Thon and Prescription Drug Take Back event](#) on Saturday, April 22nd, from 9:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m. at City Hall's west parking lot located at 505 South Garey Avenue. Vehicles should enter off of Main Street and Mission Boulevard. The Shred-A-Thon event is a great opportunity to safely dispose of sensitive documents such as old checks, bills, credit card statements, tax records and more. There is no need to remove documents from binders or hanging folders and staples, rubber bands and paper clips accepted. Our Prescription Drug Take Back event is a safe, convenient, and responsible way to dispose of unused or expired prescription drugs at locations in communities throughout the country. Unused prescription drugs thrown in the trash can be retrieved and abused or illegally sold. Proper disposal of unused drugs saves lives and protects the environment.



PUBLIC WORKS

CITY OF POMONA PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT "BOOTH'S -UP" AT CAL POLY TOWN AND GOWN EVENT

Cal Poly Pomona will host the 2023 Annual Town and Gown Ride on Friday, April 21, 2023, allowing cyclists to enjoy the outdoors, explore Pomona, and utilize the City's protected bikeway and bike lanes. This year's Town and Gown Ride offers two routes: the short route to John F. Kennedy Park (5 miles roundtrip), and a longer route to the Historic Casa Primera house (10 miles roundtrip). This event is open to students, faculty, staff, and the community.

The City of Pomona (City) will have two booths at the vendor section of this event. At one booth, City staff will be accompanied by Athens, the City's new exclusive hauler for residential and commercial trash, to explain the mandatory SB 1383 organics collection regulations, and the significance of recycling food waste in green waste bins. The link below provides more information about SB 1383 Organics. At the second booth, City staff will be accompanied by Alta Planning, the City's design consultant. Alta Planning will provide information to attendees and request feedback regarding the design of the San Jose Bike Path project, a proposed 3.5-mile bike path that runs along South Campus Drive from Temple Avenue to Murchison Avenue.

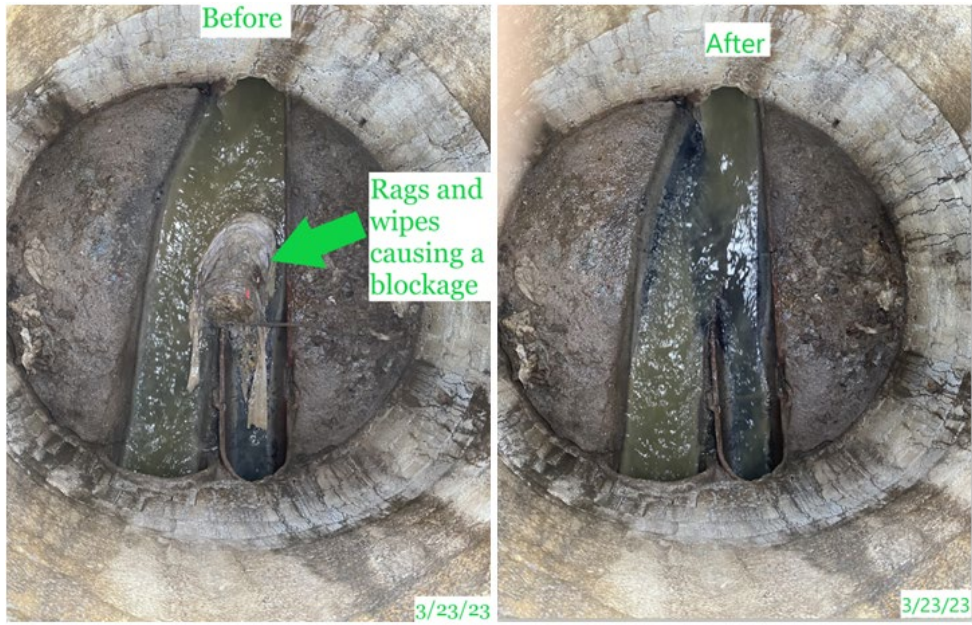
WASTEWATER OPERATIONS STAFF REMOVE EXCESS DEBRIS TO AVOID SEWER BLOCKAGE

We ask that our community members pay extra attention to what items they are using and flushing. Toilet paper may not appear that different from a paper towel, napkins, facial tissue, or personal wipe, but the key difference is in its structure. Manufacturers design toilet paper to fall apart in water so that it won't clog plumbing and sewer systems. These other material are designed to retain their shape against moisture. Although many so-called "disposable" hand wipes are advertised as being safe for flushing, in reality, they can cause backups in the system and contribute to the buildup of debris in our wastewater collection system. In some cases, they can attach to buildups of grease in the system and create blockages.

Here are some items that should not be flushed or poured down a drain:

- *Paper towels
- *Napkins
- *Wet wipes
- *Facial tissues
