COMMUNITY SERVICES RECEIVES FUNDING FOR 'INCLUSIVE POMONA' THROUGH SAN GABRIEL/POMONA REGIONAL CENTER

The San Gabriel/Pomona Regional Center recently awarded Community Services \$94,790 for Inclusive Pomona, a new project that will ultimately result in an inclusive community centered on evidence-based research, practices, and principles to better serve and meet the needs of youth, ages 3-21 years old with intellectual development disabilities (I/DD). The project will provide Pomona youth with I/DD, with opportunities to develop friendships through participation in City recreation programs that are integrated, inclusive, and accessible. The project will hire experts in inclusion and diversity to provide training to City staff, community partners of youth-serving organizations, and the general public, on a variety of topics such as diversity, equity, and accessibility. The project will hire five positions: an Inclusion Lead that will provide training on how to support youth and make recommendations to improve inclusivity in programs and four Inclusion Aides who will provide support to youth during recreation activities. INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

CYBERSECURITY UPDATE

In IT's continuous effort to harden our digital infrastructure, we have decommissioned another three obsolete servers and actively working on another three. In total, we have decommissioned 11 obsolete servers. Additionally, the City of Pomona partnered with Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA), an operational component of the Department of Homeland Security, to routinely run vulnerability scans against the city's IT infrastructure and reporting them back to IT for remediation.

HARDWARE REFRESH UPDATE

Last week, IT reported that about 50 new computers were deployed. This week, IT deployed another 25 computing devices to various departments to replace aging equipment. The IT team is also leveraging our vendor's "try and buy" programs that allow staff to test new computing devices. This program helps us to be good stewards of our budget by offering staff an opportunity ensure equipment is the right fit before we commit to purchasing it.

HEART OF THE FOOTHILLS, SUNDAY APRIL 23, 2023 (9 AM TO 4 PM)

Celebrate Earth Month on Sunday, April 23, 2023, when “open streets” return to the Cities of Claremont, Pomona, La Verne, and San Dimas for the first time in five years. Made possible by Metro Los Angeles’ Open Streets program, in coordination with the San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments (SGVCOG) and ActiveSGV, “Heart of the Foothills” will connect downtown Claremont, San Dimas, and La Verne along with Palomares Park in Pomona via a route primarily following Bonita Avenue and Arrow Highway. Thanks to the cooperation from each partnering city, attendees will have the opportunity to walk, bike, run, skate, scoot, and dance across this 6.5-mile route free of any cars in the street.

Like cicLAvia in Los Angeles, 626 Golden Streets is a FREE, family-friendly “*ciclovia*” that temporarily opens streets for people of all ages and backgrounds to enjoy in a healthy, fun, and novel fashion. The festivities will kick off at 8:30 a.m. with an official Opening Ceremony along the event route at Palomares Park in Pomona that will feature special guests, music, and free event t-shirts for the first 50 attendees.

The event is free to the general public. Attendees can start and stop at any point along the route, at any time from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Activity zones in each participating community will host live music, cultural performances, family-friendly games and activities, green vendors, zero-emission demo zones, and more! Participants are encouraged to enjoy the day by foot, bike, skate, skateboard, scooter, or any other form of active mobility. San Gabriel Valley residents in need of a bicycle for the day may reserve a GoSGV pedal-assist electric bicycle for pickup at the Claremont and San Dimas hubs for \$40. DISTRICT 4 and 6 COMMUNITY CLEANUP EVENT – SATURDAY, APRIL 15

The Community Cleanup for Districts 4 and 6 was held on Saturday, April 15, 2023 from at the Pomona Valley Transfer Station. Public Works staff attended the event to hand out flyers with important information on recycling and SB1383.

Residents dropped off large volumes of materials, including electronic waste (such as televisions, computers, and other electronic devices), used oil and oil filters.

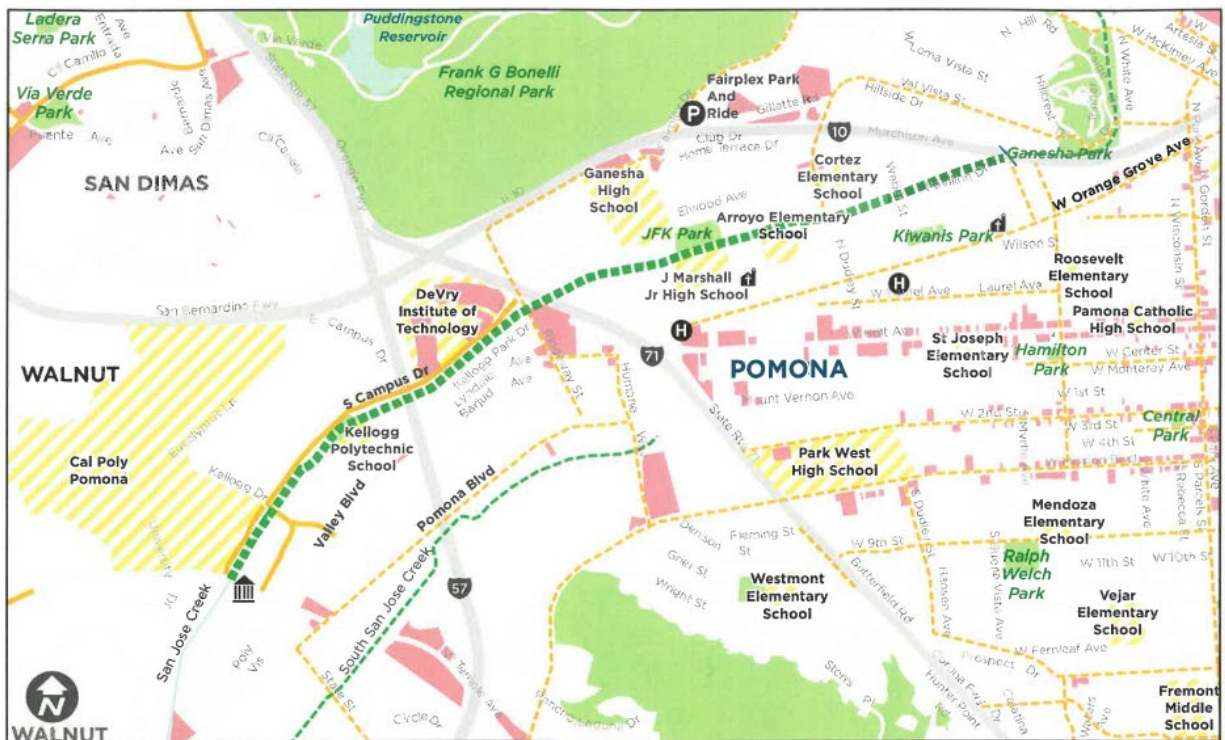
Pomona Valley Transfer Station reported 401 vehicles participated, dropping off 53.88 tons of refuse, 10.31 tons of metal goods, 44 mattresses, and 15 box springs, all of which will be recycled. Participating in the event were Corporate eWaste Solutions, collecting and recycling electronic waste, and Waste Management Curbside, collecting and recycling used oil and filters.



SAN JOSE CREEK BIKEWAY PROJECT WEBSITE

The Pomona San Jose Bikeway Project, once complete, will create a pedestrian and cyclist-friendly path that will provide connectivity for students, residents, and visitors to local schools, parks, the Los Angeles County Fairplex, and Cal Poly Pomona. The San Jose Creek Bikeway will include possible art amenities, mosaics, or murals along the path. In addition, the San Jose Creek Bikeway will have some educational features that will showcase the City's intention for sustainability.

In a joint effort, the City of Pomona and ALTA Planning & Design, the City's consultant, have created a new website for the San Jose Creek Bikeway Project (Project). WATER RESOURCES

SEWER MAIN LINE INSPECTIONS BY WASTEWATER OPERATIONS

Wastewater Operations staff have an *Envirosight* camera truck that they utilize daily for video inspections of the City’s sewer infrastructure. They conduct routine inspections of the mainline sewer and wastewater pipes, identify sources of inflow and infiltration, perform exploratory work, and respond to emergency callouts.

Below is a screenshot of the work submitted on April 11, 2023 by the Wastewater Operations Staff and submitted to a cloud-based, AI-supported platform that enables Staff to complete inspections from anywhere, track work orders, and monitor system-wide performance.
