HISTORIC PRESERVATION - PRESERVE POMONA AWARDS

On Monday night, the City Council presented the inaugural Preserve Pomona Awards to recognize outstanding achievements in historic preservation.



Awards of Merit

They presented four Awards of Merit, which recognizes the long-term preservation of our historic places. The Commission has selected one winner from each of the four local historic districts. The winners were:

April and James Chertkow for the Gertrude and EG Bangle House in Lincoln Park. The Chertkow's have restored the columns and porches and painted the exterior, among other projects, restoring the distinctive mix of Craftsman and Colonial Revival features on this house.



Nicanor Perez for the Mary and John Wright House in Wilton Heights. This house has been lovingly preserved over the years and is one of the few houses that appears to have never been altered, proving that good design is timeless.



Ercilia and Rayfield Gomez for the Chaytor Mason House in Hacienda Park. This house is a classic example of classic mid-century architecture that blends modernity and natural elements. It has kept all of its architectural detailing and is one of the best examples of mid-century architecture in Pomona. The landscaping blends in perfectly with the architectural elements and harkens to the mid-century neighborhoods of Palm Springs.



Corina and Hugo Jaramillo for the Edison Company Building in the Landmark Quarter District. This is a great example of how a single purpose building can be adaptively reused without destroying what makes it unique. The original unaltered brick detailing makes this building unique in Pomona. The landscaping complements the building and is an example of how Pomona can be more walkable.



Landscape Award

The Landscape Award, for Outstanding Achievement in the restoration or Preservation of the landscaping of an historic resource was presented to Brittany Gallivan and William Crisafi for the Jessie and William Cooper House. They researched and installed a period garden appropriate to the architecture of the house. They kept the “Hollywood” drive, pushed the garden wall back, and restored a front lawn to be compatible with the existing streetscape.

Rehabilitation Award

The Rehabilitation award recognizes achievement in the rehabilitation of the exterior of an historic resource. This year's winner is Yolanda Ponce and Baron Palacios for the Claud Heald House. This house is a shining example of how to bring back an altered historic house. This house had been significantly altered over the years. The wood windows and been removed and the siding covered. It barely resembled the Craftsman bungalow it was, in exchange for being modern. The owners however, knew what they had and brought it back. They restored the wood siding and replaced the sliding windows with appropriate wood windows. They painted the exterior with a darker color palette in keeping with Craftsman bungalow architecture, which also accentuates the original rock porch and chimney.

Restoration Award

The Restoration Award, for achievement in the restoration and preservation of an historic resource was presented to Sarah and Ryan Perez for the Dorothy and Harold Fleming House. This house was originally a great example of a simple Spanish Colonial Revival Bungalow that architecturally took its inspiration from the adobe homes of Spanish California. The simplicity of the style turned in to inspiration for generations of tract home developers in Southern California. Unfortunately, over the years the simple detailing was lost with the decorative additions like the metal shutters, rough stucco finish, and the softened color palette, which made this look more like the tract homes it was meant to inspire. The home lost its uniqueness. Today however, this house is a great example of how to restore your historic home. The owners restored the smooth plaster finish reminiscent of the lime wash used on adobes, removed the inappropriate

decorative details, and restored the color palette to accentuate the wood elements on the house in contrast to the white stucco. In short, they brought back the 1920s to their Spanish home.

Project of the Year

The Project of the year award recognizes the one project that is the best example of historic preservation. It was presented to Roxanne and Benzion Perez for the Kathryn and Stanley Curtis House. This restoration project is one that started as a disaster, but thankfully, no one was hurt. The large pine tree in the front yard, shown here in 2014, collapsed in the windstorm a winter ago. It fell through the house right where the house and the porch intersect. It damaged not only the exterior walls, roof, and porch, but many interior features, including the box beam ceiling in the dining room, architectural details, and the lathe and plaster ceilings in the living and dining rooms. Fortunately, all those features have been restored.

All of the decorative woodwork that makes a craftsman bungalow so unique is back. The box beam ceiling, the columns and beam, the picture rail, and the pocket doors, everything. On the outside, the porch has been reinforced structurally, the windows, siding, and roof repaired. This could have ended with the disaster, but instead, the owners showed us that damaged structures can be restored and our historic places do not have to be demolished.



Preservationist of the Year



The Preservationist of the year, for distinguished leadership in the preservation of Pomona’s history and heritage, goes to someone that has spent 40 years advocating for Pomona’s Historic Places. Dan McIntyre started with a meeting at the Civic Center with the intent to create a community organization that would advocate for historic preservation in Pomona. That was 1983 and that organization would become Pomona Heritage.

He has been President of Pomona Heritage ten times. He was on the Citizen’s committee that created the very first historic preservation ordinance for the City of Pomona. He has been involved with planning 35 of Pomona Heritage’s historic home tours, helped create the annual restoration workshop, and he helps community members restore their historic homes, while he’s restored numerous others himself. Finally, when he wasn’t busy with everything else, he restored his own 1895 Queen Anne Victorian home.



INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

HARDWARE REFRESH

In IT's effort to refresh dated computer equipment, another 25 computers have been replaced in the past couple of weeks for the Finance, Police, and Water Departments. We are targeting another 50 computers in the next couple weeks.

CYBERSECURITY UPDATE


Having recently partnered with Department of Homeland Security's cybersecurity arm, CISA, to assess our IT infrastructure, the agency shared their findings and recommendations last week. Since then, IT has followed the recommendations and hardened 3 server equipment while actively working on another 4 for best practices.

Two weeks ago, IT enabled strict enforcement of Sender Policy Framework (SPF) to ensure e-mails are coming from legitimate domains and IP addresses. The IT department has found this enforcement highly beneficial as it blocked many malicious e-mails. As anticipated, some e-mails were delayed for those organizations that did not have SPF configured as they needed to be released from quarantine manually. However, as a result of this effort, many organizations that we interact with regularly have since adopted SPF to keep themselves and the City of Pomona safe from spoofing.

Thanks to a grant from the CA State Library, Pomona Public Library is happy to offer our Zip Books program! If you need a book that we don't already own, just come in to place a request and the library will purchase the item from Amazon. The book is shipped directly to your address, and when finished you just return it to the library so it can be added to the collection. 

SIRENS OF SILENCE EVENT

On April 29th the Pomona Police Department partnered with the Los Angeles County Fire Department for their *Sirens of Silence* program. This program was created to bring awareness and foster inclusivity to the growing population with special needs, especially individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, one in 36 children is diagnosed with ASD. For some children with ASD, seeing a fully-suited first responder can provide a sense of uneasiness. Lights and sirens can also cause sensory overload and be overwhelming. To help familiarize and expose individuals with ASD to first responders, the Los Angeles County Fire Department’s Sirens of Silence program works with local organizations, so children with ASD and their parents/caregivers can meet firefighters, police officers, and EMTs and see/touch the equipment and apparatuses in a quiet, less stimulating setting.



WATER RESOURCES

MAY IS WATER AWARENESS MONTH

Water Awareness Month was created in response to the drought that occurred from 1987 to 1992. Its purpose is to educate the public on how to use water resources efficiently. Given the recent drought in California, water suppliers such as the City of Pomona have implemented water restrictions and promoted water conservation efforts. These measures are important for managing our water resources sustainably and preventing environmental damage. By working together, we can create a water-efficient future for generations to come.

As we observe Water Awareness Month, the City strives to enhance public understanding about important water-related subjects, with a particular focus on conservation. To achieve this goal, the City uses different communication platforms such as its official website, and social media outlets to reach a broader audience and share valuable information with the community. By utilizing these channels, the City intends to make a positive impact and raise awareness about the importance of responsible water use and management.



We would like to kindly remind you of our **two-day-a-week** watering schedule from April to October. On Mondays and Thursdays, odd addresses are permitted to water, while even addresses may water on Tuesdays and Fridays. We encourage you to avoid watering between 10:00 am to 6:00 pm. To report water waste or if you have concerns regarding water conservation, you can reach us at 909-620-2244. Let's all make an effort to conserve water every day, regardless of the weather.
