### **HUMAN RESOURCES**

Thursday, June 8<sup>th</sup> was the culmination of the Summer Session of the Supervisor's Toolkit Training for City of Pomona supervisors and managers. Each session, a City Leader came to show their support, including Mayor Tim Sandoval. There is one more session of the Supervisors Toolkit Training scheduled to begin in September 2023.



### INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

### ANOTHER THREE BITE THE DUST

Continuing with IT's focus on heightening its cybersecurity posture, the Police Department Information Technology (PDIT) team successfully eliminated another three servers that are either already or are approaching end-of-life (EOL). Many breaches occur from bad actors exploiting vulnerabilities found in antiquated systems that are no longer supported by manufacturers, hence it is important that IT eliminate EOL devices timely.

### **BIOS – BECAUSE IT OFFERS SECURITY**

While technically BIOS stands for Basic Input and Output System and is responsible for a computer's data flow between the hardware and the operating system, our newly created acronym describes IT's initiative this week as we will upgrade the BIOS for all of our virtual host servers for performance and cybersecurity improvement. To avoid service disruptions, virtual guest machines will be moved to different hosts as we work through each host. Additionally, IT is upgrading the firmware on our e-mail security gateway to keep the City of Pomona's e-mail system protected.

### **POLICE**

### OFFICERS AWARDED LIFE SAVING MEDALS

During the June 5<sup>th</sup> Council Meeting, Officers Monique Gonzales, Alejandro Lopez and Humberto Sanchez Jr. were awarded Life Saving Medals.

On Wednesday, January 5, 2022, Officer Alejandro Lopez and retired Officer Sean Gonzalez responded to a CPR call at Planet Fitness gym. A male patron had fallen in the dressing room and stopped breathing. The Officers arrived before LA County Fire. Without hesitation, Officer Lopez took over for two citizens who had started life saving measures. Officer Lopez directed the citizens and began chest compressions himself, as well as directing the utilization of a defibrillator. When LACF arrived, Officer Lopez still took the primary role in chest compressions while LACF assisted. After 15 minutes of performing lifesaving measures, switching off between chest compressions, utilizing the "ambu bag" and working collaboratively with LACF, the subject finally got a heartbeat. The subject was stabilized and transported to PVHMC. In the words of LACF Captain Miller, "If it was not for Officer Lopez's actions, the subject would not have lived."

On Sunday, February 13, 2022 Officer Monique Gonzales and her Field Training Officer Bert Sanchez were dispatched to an emergency call for service where an older adult male who was choking. Upon arriving to the call, the Officers acted quickly once they arrived. The 83-year old victim was unconscious, not breathing, and had no pulse. Officer Gonzales and Officer Sanchez immediately began administering CPR and continued for five minutes. Just before LA County Fire arrived on scene, Officer Gonzales and Officer Sanchez noticed a faint pulse and the victim began to show signs of labored breathing. Fire took over treatment and transported the victim to the hospital where hospital staff were able to remove a piece of food from the victim's throat and he was stabilized. It was Officer Gonzales and Officer Sanchez's swift action that was instrumental in saving the victim's life that day.

### SPECIAL OLYMPICS LAW ENFORCEMENT TORCH RUN

On Monday, June 5<sup>th</sup> Pomona Police Department personnel participated in the Special Olympics Law Enforcement Torch Run. The Special Olympics Law Enforcement Torch Run was created by Police Chief Richard LaMunyon in 1981 in Wichita, Kansas. Police Chief LaMunyon wanted to bridge the gap between law enforcement and the community by raising awareness and funds for Special Olympics.

Currently, the fundraiser has more than 97,000 law enforcement agencies that participate in the Special Olympics Law Enforcement Torch Run. Representatives from each agency run a torch, known as the Flame of Hope, and a flag through their city. This year, we ran the flag and the torch from the Pomona Police Station, south on Garey Avenue and ended at Riverside Drive, approximately a 2.3 mile run. The torch was then handed over the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department to continue the run. Thank you to all runners of the police department and from the Special Olympics for participating in this event!

### STREET PRESERVATION - LOCAL CITYWIDE FY22-23

On April 17, 2023, the City Council awarded a construction contract in the amount of \$2,760,000 for "Street Preservation-Local (FY22-23)," Project No. 428-2590-xxxxx-68582 (Project). The contract for this Project was awarded to Hardy & Harper, Inc. (Contractor). This Project will consist of rehabilitating existing streets per the City's Pavement Management Program, with treatments of mainly grind and overlay. The list of streets to be rehabilitated is attached. Some curb and gutter, sidewalk, and curb ramp improvements will be included. Streets awarded as additive alternates will be completed, as funds allow.

Construction is scheduled to start Summer 2023 and be completed Fall 2024, as weather and other factors permit. The Contractor will send notices to neighboring residents, businesses, and schools prior to starting work notifying them of the construction. The work hours will be 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. The adjacent neighborhoods can expect to see temporarily modified traffic flow during the construction. This Project supports the City Council priorities and goals of improving street and associated sidewalk conditions.

### WATER RESOURCES

### HOW TO READ YOUR WATER METER

The City of Pomona utilizes water meters to accurately measure the amount of water our valued customers consume. Our dedicated Water Meter Readers conduct routine checks every other month to determine usage and billing. In addition to our team's efforts, customers are welcome to monitor their own usage by checking their water meter. This proactive measure can also help identify any potential leaks, providing an opportunity to address the issue promptly.

❖ This image of a meter is a typical representation of what most meters look like.

**Dial:** The dial will rotate when water passes through the meter. One full rotation of the dial equals 1 cubic foot of water or 7.48 gallons.

- ➤ Water meters measure cubic feet of water used. To convert cubic feet to gallons, multiply the number of cubic feet by 7.48.
- ➤ The City of Pomona measures water use by units for billing purposes: 1 unit of water billed = 100 cubic feet = 748 gallons.

Low Flow Indicator: The Low Flow Indicator is extremely sensitive and will rotate with even the slightest water movement. It has the ability to detect any water passing through the meter, allowing for the quick identification of even the smallest of leaks.



**Odometer:** The water meter odometer functions similarly to a car odometer, accurately recording the total amount of water consumed. Its display represents 1 cubic foot, 10 cubic feet, 100 cubic feet, and so on. Like with a car odometer, it is impossible to manipulate or modify the water meter odometer.

**How to Monitor Your Water Use:** The following steps will show you how to determine how much water you use over a period of time.

- 1. Read the odometer and write it down. Then write down the date you read it. After a period of days (we suggest 7 days) read the odometer again and write it down and write down the date.
- 2. Subtract the first reading from the second reading. This is your water use in cubic feet during the period.
- 3. Multiply the water use by 7.48. This is your water use in gallons during the period.
- 4. Divide the water use in gallons by the number of days between readings. This is your average gallons per day during the period.
