COMMUNITY CENTER INTERNET UPDATE

Having deployed Wi-Fi pilot at Garfield Community Center last week, IT proceeded with another pilot at Kiwanis Community Center. Testing involves ensuring quality connections and validating user experience when the same device uses public Wi-Fi at different Community Centers. IT will continue our partnership with Community Services to test and pilot the new equipment and to prioritize other community centers to install public Wi-Fi.

PDIT UPDATES

The Police Department Information Technology (PDIT) team have now deployed 55 of the 60 Mobile Data Terminals (MDTs). MDTs are computers used by police officers in patrol vehicles. Ten of the replaced MDT units have also been repurposed and completely deployed to Field Training Officers (FTOs). Additionally, after successfully migrated to our new Network-attached Storage (NAS) a couple of weeks ago, the team is now decommissioning and returning the older appliance to receive credit from the vendor.

PUBLIC WORKS

SCHEDULED SR-71 FREEWAY CLOSURES - AUGUST 12TH & AUGUST 19TH

As part of the ongoing efforts to keep the roads and highways operational during the construction of the SR-71 widening project, Caltrans will have intermitting closures of the SR-71 on August 12th, and August 19th, 2023. This is to allow for overhead electrical transmission lines and telecommunications work. It is anticipated that these closures will be a limited duration of approximately one day each and overnight, to the extent possible. This upcoming work will require the following closures:
