YOUTH & GOVERNMENT EXPANDS TO HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH IN POMONA

Youth and Government is a national YMCA program that empowers both middle school and high school students in the U.S. by providing the opportunity to learn and experience government policies and methodologies firsthand. For the past two years, City of Pomona has partnered with the YMCA of Orange County to increase civic engagement opportunities for Pomona's youth by establishing a United Nations Program for middle school students. Now, we are offering Pomona high school students the opportunity to join Model Legislature & Court (MLC). This will be the first time the City of Pomona has participated in MLC. This FREE, six-month program is modeled after California's legislature and courts and provides a learn-by-doing experience that will teach teens the values of democracy and inspire them to develop integrity and social responsibility as they deliberate issues faced in the state and in their communities. Beginning August 2023, monthly workshops will offer teens the following skills to help them transition and succeed with ease from high school through college graduation: leadership skills, public speaking experience, core values and teamwork, research, critical thinking and analysis, greater understanding of civic engagement, and addressing issues on local, statewide and national levels. The program concludes in February 2024 at a final conference in Sacramento with other high school students from across the state. Registration opens on Monday, August 14, 2023. SENIORS RECEIVE VOUCHERS FOR FRESH PRODUCE

The Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP) is a federally funded program administered by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food and Nutrition Services Agency. The goal of SFMNP is to provide fresh, nutritious, unprepared, locally-grown produce to low-income seniors 60+ that meet income criteria provided by the County. During the week of July 24, 2023, 45 seniors at Washington Park and 45 seniors at Palomares Park received a \$50 voucher to be used at local farmers markets.

HUNDREDS OF YOUTH RECEIVE BACK TO SCHOOL SUPPLIES

On Saturday, August 5, 2023, Community Services hosted its first-ever *Back to School Giveback and Skate Jam* at Palomares Park. INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

ALL SWITCHED OUT

At the start of this calendar year, IT initiated an effort to modernize our network infrastructure by replacing 28 network switches. Thanks to staff's dedication and commitment, we have completely replaced all 28 switches well ahead of schedule. As a result, IT procured another set of five switches to prepare for the next round of hardware refresh. This modernization effort will benefit the City of Pomona by strengthening our cybersecurity posture and improve overall network performance.

CYBERSECURITY UPDATE

As the IT team continues to work through Homeland Security's cybersecurity recommendations through CISA (Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency), we have resolved another 28 findings from CISA's report since our last update on July 27. IT staff remains focused on cybersecurity to protect the city's digital infrastructure and have completed more than 120 CISA recommendations in total since we partnered with Homeland Security in April. Please check back for more updates as we continue to heighten our cybersecurity posture.

SUMMER READING CHALLENGE AND SUMMER EVENT WRAPUP!

Thank you to everyone who joined the Library for an amazing, record-breaking summer! We had 94 Teen/Tween signups and 279 Kid/Tween signups for the Reading Challenge, with an estimated 3,125 books read - this was up more than 200% from last year. Great job to all of the participants! We also had 10 weeks of programs and events including magicians, animal shows, Chess and Video Game Club, and the end of Summer Foam Party and Teen Gaming Pizza Party. There were more than 1500 attendees overall, and more than 300 free books given out throughout the summer! Already looking forward to next year, and also to our Fall/Winter programming events which will be announced soon!

RENT STABILIZATION COUNCIL SESSION - MONDAY, AUGUST 14, 2023

The City of Pomona is seeking community input as it develops permanent rent stabilization measures to replace urgency measures enacted by the adoption of Urgency Ordinance Nos. 4320 and 4329. As part of this process, the City is analyzing best practices in other jurisdictions and studying additional regulatory frameworks to implement rent stabilization measures. The City hired RSG, Inc. to prepare a study that details the long term implementation of rent stabilization measures in Pomona. RSG will gather input and feedback from community stakeholders at the [August 14th Study Session](#) to ensure that the long term implementation study considers community needs and includes an evaluation of topics that may be considered by City Council.

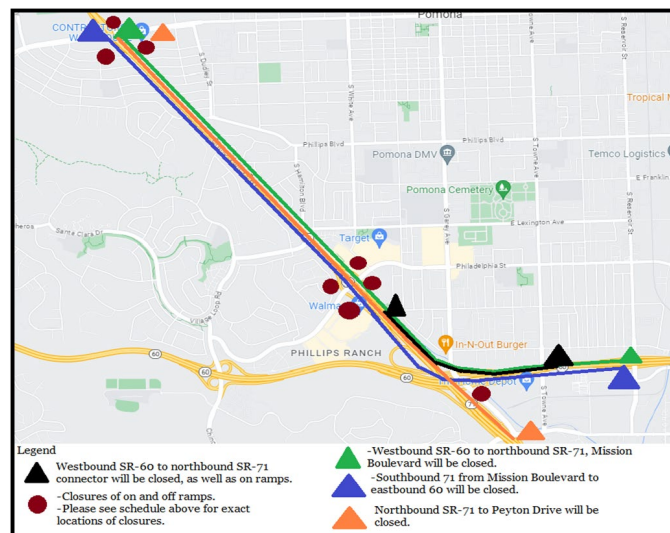
PUBLIC WORKS

SCHEDULED SR-71 FREEWAY CLOSURE - AUGUST 12, 2023

As part of the ongoing efforts to keep the roads and highways operational during the construction of the SR-71 Widening Project, Caltrans will have intermitting closures of the SR-71 on August 12, 2023. This is to allow for overhead electrical transmission lines and telecommunications work. It is anticipated that these closures will be limited to approximately one day each and overnight, to the extent possible. This upcoming work will require the following closures:

- **Saturday, August 12, 2023 to Sunday, August 13, 2023 from 7:00 PM to 3:00 PM**
 1. Westbound SR-60 to northbound SR-71 connector will be closed, as well as ramps from 7:00 PM to 11:00 AM.
 2. Northbound SR-71 off-ramp at Mission Boulevard will be closed from 7:00 PM to 3:00 PM.
 3. Northbound SR-71 off-ramp at Rio Rancho Road will be closed from 7:00 PM to 3:00 PM.
 4. Northbound SR-71 on-ramp at Rio Rancho Road will be closed from 7:00 PM to 3:00 PM.
 5. Northbound SR-71 on-ramp at Garey Avenue will be closed from 7:00 PM to 3:00 PM.
 6. Southbound SR-71 on-ramp at Mission Boulevard will be closed from 7:00 PM to 3:00 PM.
 7. Southbound SR-71 on-ramp at Rio Rancho Road will be closed from 7:00 PM to 3:00 PM.
 8. Southbound SR-71 off-ramp at Rio Rancho Road will have only one lane open from 7:00 PM to 3:00 PM.
 9. Westbound SR-60 to northbound SR-71 at Mission Boulevard will be closed from 11:00 PM to 7:00 AM.
 10. Southbound SR-71 from Mission Boulevard to eastbound SR-60 will be closed from 11:00 PM to 8:00 AM.
 11. Mainline from Peyton Drive to Mission Boulevard will be closed from 11:00 PM to 7:00 AM.
