



# WILTON HEIGHTS HISTORIC DISTRICT

The Wilton Heights Historic District was designated on August 2, 1999. Wilton Heights has the most eclectic group of architectural styles of any of Pomona's Historic Districts. It contains historic properties from the late 1800s to the 1950s.

The district is named after the Wilton Brothers, William and Edwin. As builder-designers, they constructed more than 600 buildings in Pomona with much of their residential architectural work occurring in Wilton Heights. William Wilton even lived in Wilton Heights for 28 years. Wilton Heights also saw development during the post-war boom in the 1940s and 50s, including the commercialization of Holt and Garey Avenues. Today it is a diverse architectural neighborhood, with multiple styles and housing types.

The Wilton Heights Historic District is generally located between White Avenue on the West, Garey Avenue on the East, Holt Avenue on the South, and Orange Grove Avenue on the North.
