COMMUNITY CENTER WI-FI UPDATE

Last week, IT deployed public Wi-Fi at Willie White Community Center and this week, we are enthused to announce that we also deployed successfully to John F. Kennedy Community Center. In total, we have deployed to five community centers (Garfield, Kiwanis, Philadelphia, Willie White, and Kennedy). IT's next step is to procure additional networking equipment for Wi-Fi deployment to the remaining community centers (Ganesha, Jaycee, La Casita, Palomares, Ralph Welch, Renacimiento, Washington, and Westmont). CYBERSECURITY UPDATE

Since IT's last cybersecurity update on 8/10, we have implemented another seven recommendations from CISA (Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency), the cybersecurity arm under Department of Homeland Security. As IT continues to work through CISA's recommendations, IT is working towards the next iteration of cybersecurity services offered by CISA to continue improving the City of Pomona's

cybersecurity posture. IT continuously monitors for the latest vulnerabilities and trends to protect the City's digital assets.

<u>SAFETY IS SHARING, SAFETY IS CARING: SEPTEMBER IS PEDESTRIAN</u> SAFETY MONTH

September is Pedestrian Safety Month in California and the Pomona Police Department encourages everyone on our roads to care for one another and keep pedestrians safe from crashes and injuries.

Based on data projections from the Governors Highway Safety Association, 7,508 pedestrians were killed in traffic crashes in the U.S. in 2022, the highest number since 1981. In California, pedestrian deaths account for more than 25% of all traffic deaths.

To promote the safety of people walking, the Pomona Police Department will conduct traffic safety operations in the month of September focused on the most dangerous driver behaviors that put the safety of pedestrians at risk. These violations include speeding, making illegal turns, failing to yield and running stop signs or signals.

The Pomona Police Department offers safe driving and walking tips including staying off the phone when behind the wheel or walking.

Drivers

- Do not speed, and slow down at intersections. Be prepared to stop for pedestrians at marked and unmarked crosswalks.
- Avoid blocking crosswalks while waiting to make a right-hand turn.
- Never drive impaired.

Pedestrians

 Be predictable. Use signalized crosswalks where drivers may anticipate foot traffic.

- Watch for approaching vehicles and practice due care crossing the street. At 30 mph, a driver needs at least 90 feet to stop.
- Make it easier for drivers to see you at night wear light colors, reflective material and use a flashlight.
- Be careful crossing streets or entering crosswalks at night or on busier streets with higher speed limits.
