COMMUNITY CENTER WI-FI UPDATE

Having rolled out Community Services public Wi-Fi to five local community centers (Garfield, Kiwanis, Philadelphia, Willie White, and Kennedy) during the summer, the IT Department resumed deployment with recent receipt of a new batch of networking equipment. We are excited to announce that public Wi-Fi was successfully deployed to Ralph Welch Park Community Center last week! Check back as IT continues to work on remaining community centers (Ganesha, Jaycee, La Casita, Palomares, Renacimiento, Washington, and Westmont).

CYBERSECURITY UPDATE

With cybersecurity threats growing, it is important for IT to stay on top of the latest threats and ensure our environment is kept up to date and patched. For the past couple of weeks, the IT Department diligently updated and patched the City's host servers that house over 100 virtual servers. This effort is in addition to IT's routine monthly patch process that keeps all of the City's virtual servers up to date.

BROADBAND STUDY

The San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments (SGVCOG) is conducting an internet availability study to understand where affordable and reliable internet may be lacking in the region. We encourage all Pomona residents to contribute to the study by filling out the survey at https://www.sgvcog.org/broadband. The City of Pomona IT is continuing to collaborate with SGVCOG to assess internet needs in the region as mutual support is expected as recipients of CPUC's Local Agency Technical Assistant (LATA) grant. The IT Team is drafting an RFP (Request for Proposal) for local broadband studies on accessibility, availability, and affordability challenges. Further, feasibility study and costs assessment will be included on overcoming or lessening those challenges.


COMMUNTY INPUT NEEDED FOR YOUTH OUTDOOR PROGRAM GRANT OPPORTUNITY

WATER RESOURCES

MEMBER AGENCY ADMINISTERED INCENTIVE PROGRAMS (MAAP) GRANT

The Water Resources Department (WRD) submitted a grant application worth \$20,000 to the MWD MAAP grant project through Three Valley's Municipal Water District (TVMWD) in August 2023. We are excited to announce that the City has been awarded the grant funds, as our application has been successful.

The main objective of the grant is to promote water efficiency among residents by offering a free Residential Landscape Evaluation. This initiative strives to empower our community to make informed choices about their water usage habits. The program will

be available on a first-come, first-serve basis until the grant funds are fully allocated.

In order to facilitate the successful implementation of this initiative, the City has collaborated with Conserv Construction Inc. Their tier 1 program will offer informative and educational services to our residents. In addition, residents who opt for the weather-based controller option will receive a landscape evaluation, a Wi-Fi-compatible irrigation controller installed, programmed, and free training, along with lifetime technical support.

The primary focus of this initiative is to increase water conservation awareness in our resident's yards. Our staff is confident that this program will receive enthusiastic participation from our community.
