#### **SPRING EGG HUNT EVENT**



### INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

#### FUEL MANAGEMENT SYSTEM UPGRADE

In the past few months, IT worked closely with Fleet to coordinate an upgrade of its Fuel Management System and to migrate off of the application server that is nearing end-of-life (EOL). This effort was completed successfully this week thanks to the close collaboration between Departments. Besides cybersecurity benefits of running modern server operating systems and current application versions, the upgrade also introduces new features that eases the efforts of importing and exporting fuel reports, introduces alert notifications, and offers interfaces for future integration with other application systems.


#### **CYBERSECURITY UPDATE**

The firmware update addresses exploits that allow bad actors to remotely take control of affected systems.

#### POLICE DEPARTMENT PARTICIPATES IN GUN BURN

On February 8, 2024, our Property and Evidence and Special Investigations Units coordinated the annual dangerous weapons destruction. Each year the Pomona Police Department destroys dangerous weapons such as rifles, shotguns, handguns, knives, swords, etc. that are either recovered as found property, were surrendered voluntarily or ordered for destruction by the court following a case adjudication. This year, the total weight of weapons destroyed exceeded 1000 lbs.

Following the destruction process, the ground-up material is carefully inspected, and any items that were not completely destroyed are subject to the process a second time. The ground-up metal resulting from this procedure will be repurposed and utilized in the manufacturing of rebar, contributing to sustainable resource utilization.


#### CONFLUENCE CHOKEPOINT RELIEF PROJECT SR-60 CLOSURES

The Confluence Chokepoint Relief Project (Project) will help to improve congestion at the State Route 57 (SR-57) and State Route 60 (SR-60) area of confluence between the City of Diamond Bar and the City of Industry. Golden Springs Dr. will be closed at Copley Dr. during the day (**Map A**). The eastbound SR-60 Diamond Bar Blvd. on-and off-ramps will be closed (**Map B**). Lanes on SR-60 near the interchange may experience intermittent closures throughout the night.

The impacts of this Project's construction in the City of Pomona will be vehicles detouring off the eastbound SR-60 at Diamond Bar Blvd. and traveling through the City to get back onto the eastbound SR-60. It is anticipated that vehicles will be directed back to the SR-60 via Diamond Bar Blvd./Mission Blvd. and the SR-71.

# <u>ADA CURB RAMPS AND PATH OF TRAVEL – CITYWIDE (CDBG) (FY2022-23)</u>


On January 9, 2024, the City Council awarded a contract to Garcon Construction. Inc. (Contractor) to construct ADA curb ramps, repair sidewalks, and adjacent public facilities at various locations throughout the City to improve public access.

The Project scope will include the installation of ADA-compliant curb ramps, alley approaches, as well as sidewalk, curb and gutter repairs. The Contractor will coordinate with schools, businesses, and residents in and around the locations to minimize construction impacts. The Contractor will work during the school's off-peak times when construction can be done with the least amount of disruption to the students.

Construction is scheduled to begin in late March 2024 and be completed by the end of the Summer 2024. The Location Map below shows the vicinity of where the work will be performed.

Flyers with Project information will be distributed to all schools, businesses, and residents in the construction areas. Each flyer will provide contact information for any questions or concerns involving this Project.

Proper traffic control will be implemented during all of the construction phases of the Project.



## POMONA MULTI-NEIGHBORHOOD PEDESTRIAN AND BICYCLE IMPROVEMENTS ATP CYCLE 4

The Pomona Multi-Neighborhood Pedestrian and Bicycle Improvements Project (Project), funded by Active Transportation Program (ATP) Cycle 4, will construct various pedestrian and bicycle improvements throughout the City, including the City's first roundabouts. A majority of this Project is funded with a \$10 million ATP Cycle 4

grant that the City received in 2019, and includes funds from County Measures R and M, Prop C, and Gas Tax. The overall budget for this Project is approximately \$17.6 million.

In receiving the ATP Cycle 4 grant, one of the requirements of the Project is to construct improvements near and along local school frontages in Pomona. Because of the required construction near schools, much of the work will be constructed during the summer break; however, due to the large size of this Project, some construction will need to take place during the school year. Construction is anticipated to begin in March 2024 with completion expected in July 2025. See Project maps in Attachments.

According to the base bids and additive alternates, the scope of work is as follows:

- The "Base Bid" includes all work required by the grant including new bicycle and pedestrian facilities, as well as, limited re-paving/slurry seals of streets for vehicular traffic and some additional sidewalk, pedestrian, traffic signal, as well as, three roundabout improvements.
- Additive Alternate No. 1 includes paving of La Verne Ave., Val Vista St., a portion of Ninth St. (and minor portion of Humane Way), and installation of ten Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFB).
- Additive Alternate No. 2 includes sidewalk improvements and related work (curbs, alley approaches, meter boxes, etc.).
- Additive Alternate No. 3 includes traffic signal improvements at various locations (Dudley St./Elwood St., Orange Grove Ave./Dudley St., Ninth St./White Ave., Phillips Blvd./Garey Ave., and Towne Ave./Phillips Blvd.).
- Additive Alternate No. 4 includes paving for Ninth St. from Hamilton Blvd. to White Ave.
- Additive Alternate No. 5 includes paving for Ninth St. from Buena Vista Ave. to Hamilton Blvd.
- Additive Alternate No. 6 includes paving for Phillips Blvd. from Hamilton Blvd. to Garey Ave. (\*not currently included).
- Additive Alternate No. 7 includes traffic signal improvements at Franklin Ave. and Reservoir St. (\*not currently included).
- Additive Alternate No. 8 includes a roundabout improvement at Phillips Blvd. and San Antonio Ave. (\*not currently included).

\*As additional funds are identified, City Staff will seek to include Additive Alternate Nos. 6 through 8 to the Project scope of work.
