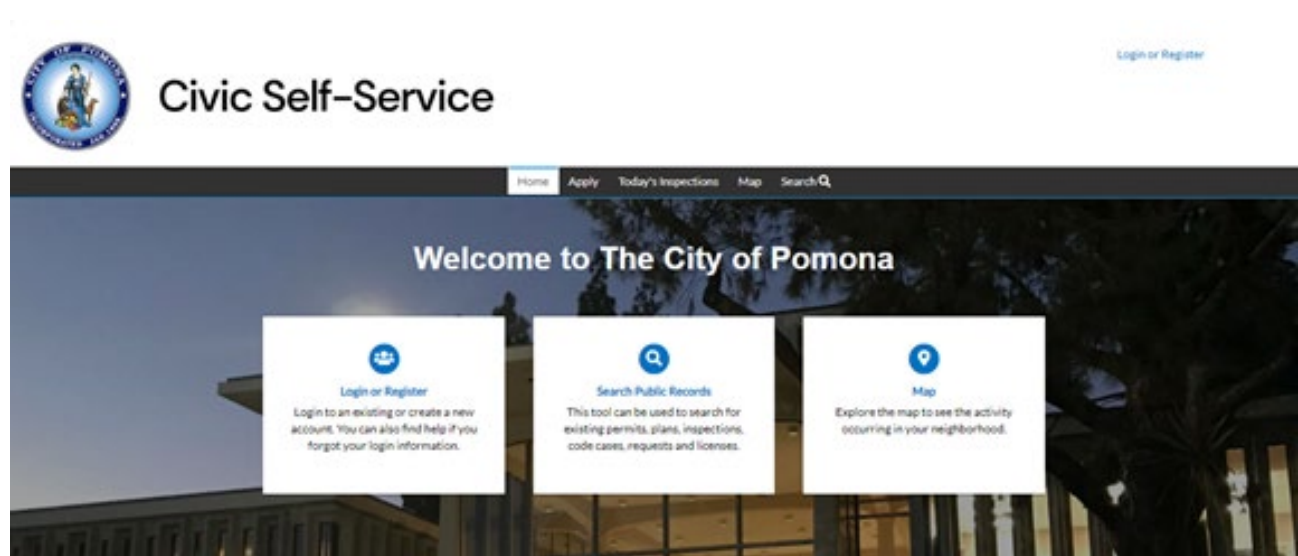
COMMUNITY CENTERS – IT UPDATES

IT is excited to share another successful deployment of four new community computers at Westmont Park Community Center. PERMITTING & LICENSING APP UPGRADE

This week, the City of Pomona upgraded its Permitting and Licensing application to better serve the community. The upgrade modernizes the application and enables City staff to consolidate and simplify workflows. The optimization of workflows will then position the City to introduce additional self-service offerings on our [Civic Self Service portal](#) such as renewing permits and electronic planning reviews. Currently, the portal only supports new solar permit applications, but stay tune for more updates as the City expand its offerings!

METROLINK NIGHT AND WEEKEND RAILROAD MAINTENANCE WORK

Metrolink will conduct night and weekend railroad maintenance along the San Bernardino line between the cities of La Verne and Pomona.

To keep train service reliable, Metrolink crews will perform railroad maintenance work along the tracks throughout the Metrolink rail system. This work restores and extends the lifespan of worn tracks to keep the railroad safely-maintained and ensure a safe, pleasant ride for customers.

Work will take place between 8 p.m. and 5 a.m. beginning Monday, April 1st through Sunday, April 7th. Schedule is subject to change due to weather or unforeseen circumstances. During this work, Metrolink anticipates the following impacts:

- Noise, lights, sparks, and dust from heavy machinery. Local fire departments will be made aware that sparks produced from the project will be visible to the public and cause no danger to the community.

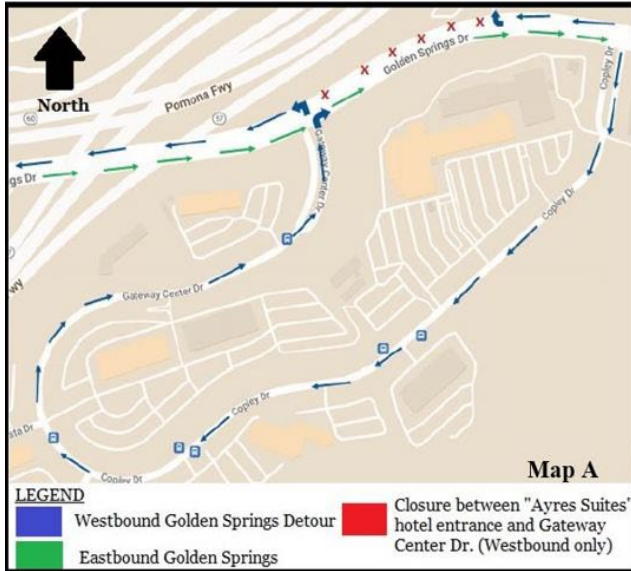
CONFLUENCE CHOKEPOINT RELIEF PROJECT SR-60 CLOSURES

The Confluence Chokepoint Relief Project (Project) will help to improve congestion at the State Route 57 (SR-57) and State Route 60 (SR-60) area of confluence between the City of Diamond Bar and the City of Industry. Golden Springs Dr. will be closed at Copley Dr. during daytime hours (Map A). Grand Ave on- and off-ramps will be closed overnight (Map B). This work will lead to specific lane and ramp closures on the Eastbound SR-60 overnight.

The impacts of this Project's construction in the City of Pomona will be vehicles detouring off the eastbound SR-60 at Diamond Bar Blvd. and traveling through the City to get back onto the eastbound SR-60. It is anticipated that vehicles will be directed back to the SR-60 via Diamond Bar Blvd./Mission Blvd. and the SR-71.

- Eastbound SR-60 Grand Ave On – Ramp Closure closed on Monday, April 1, 2024 through Friday, April 5, 2024 (7 p.m. – 6 a.m.)
- Some lanes on Eastbound SR-60 will be closed overnight from Monday, April 1, 2024 through Friday, April 5, 2024 (11 p.m. – 5 a.m.)
