GIS APPLICATION UPGRADE





<u>COMMUNITY MEMBERS PARTICIPATE IN DEPARTMENT'S SHRED-A-</u> THON & PRESCRIPTION DRUG TAKE BACK EVENT

The Pomona Police Department held its annual Shred-a-thon & Drug Take Back event on Saturday, April 20th. The purpose of this event was to invite the community to safely dispose of medications and sensitive documents at a location they can trust. This event led to the collection of **68** pounds of expired, unused, and unwanted drugs and safely disposed of **3,060** pounds of sensitive documents.





COPS 4 KIDS COMMUNITY EVENT

On Saturday, April 20th, Pomona Resource Officers and Junior Cadets of the Cops 4 Kids program participated in their second community event of the session. The Junior Cadets of Cortez Elementary School volunteered their time to help beautify Palomares Park. Cops 4 Kids is a Police Department program that is conducted at various elementary schools within our City for student's ages 9-13 years old. It consists of a 10-week program in which officers from our department work with students to build confidence, encourage positive life choices, promote the importance of self-discipline, and leadership. Junior Cadets are encouraged to give back to their community by participating in civic duties such as this community event. This is just one opportunity for our Junior Cadets to play a constructive role and show respect for their community.







PUBLIC WORKS

METROLINK DAYTIME AND NIGHTTIME SAFETY EQUIPMENT TESTING

As part of the Foothill Gold Line light rail project, crews will be working daily/nightly at the Fulton Rd. railroad crossing in the cities of La Verne and Pomona. Crews will complete the testing of the already installed safety equipment, gate arms, and signals. During these operations, the gate arms will be raised and dropped for approximately 2-3 minutes at a time. The crossing bells will be shut off during nighttime testing. Equipment testing is required to ensure that all safety equipment is functional. Though traffic will be maintained at all times with the exception of the 2-3 minute intervals. Emergency responders will have immediate thru access when required.

Work will take place between 9 a.m. - 3 p.m. and 10 p.m. - 4 p.m. through Saturday, April 27.

During this work, Metrolink anticipates the following impacts:

- The Fulton Rd. railroad crossing, between Arrow Hwy. and Bonita Ave. will be affected during the testing. Metrolink parking and pedestrian access will be maintained through railroad crossings.
- Occasional longer work hours and testing on Sundays may be performed during the period.
- Noise from construction equipment will be produced near the active work zones. Lights will be onsite.
- The crossing bells will be shut off during nighttime testing, but will ring during daytime testing.



SCHEDULED SR-71 FREEWAY CLOSURES

As part of the ongoing efforts to keep the roads and highways operational, Caltrans will implement various closures along the State Route 71 (SR-71) beginning on Monday, April 29, 2024 through Friday, May 3, 2024 for road repair work. Residents and businesses located near the SR-71 are advised to anticipate noise and vibrations associated with construction activities.

Motorists should expect delays and are strongly advised to avoid the area and use alternate routes. Additionally, motorists can check traffic conditions before they leave by visiting the Caltrans "Quickmap": QuickMap (ca.gov)

Caltrans reminds motorists to "Be Work Zone Alert" and "Slow for the Cone Zone."



WATER RESOURCES

<u>CALIFORNIA'S LOW INCOME HOUSEHOLD WATER ASSISTANCE</u> PROGRAM HAS ENDED

California's Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) was a limited-term, federally funded program that offered assistance to help low-income households pay their residential water and sewer bills. The program is no longer accepting applications.

The LIHWAP program paid out \$316,309.68 to 367 Pomona residents from October 2022 to March 2024 to help pay their water and sewer bills.

SOUTH WALL GRAFITTI CLEANUP

Construction is occurring at 752 W. Commercial St. at the new Water Resources Department (WRD) building site. The site includes a new perimeter wrought iron fence and block wall improvements. The new southern boundary block wall was vandalized with graffiti. WRD Staff cleaned up and covered the defacement by painting the entire wall. CLAREMONT TRANSMISSION BUTTERFLY VALVE INSTALLATION

On April 22nd, Staff addressed a construction item associated with an existing twenty-inch (20") steel water main. Water Distribution staff began a project to insert a 20" butterfly valve to the main within Lansbury Avenue. Per the photo below one can see how close the residential area is to the work area. City staff maintained site cleaning, sweeping, and debris management during the construction work.
