

PUBLIC WORKS

POMONA QUIET ZONE SUSPENSION

There are two railroad corridors that currently travel through the City of Pomona. The railroad corridor through Downtown Pomona has been established as a Quiet Zone. It should be noted that even in a Quiet Zone, train engineers are obligated to blow the horn when they foresee a dangerous situation (e.g. motorists or pedestrians attempting to cross) or in an emergency situation. The northerly railroad corridor, between Arrow Hwy. and Bonita Ave., is currently not a Quiet Zone.

During a recent inspection in May 2024, the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) identified a list of corrective items (signage, striping, median islands) to be addressed as part of the requirements to preserve the Quiet Zone designation. Until these corrective items can be addressed and mitigated, the FRA has suspended the Quiet Zone designation. As a result, you may hear the blowing of the train horns more frequently.

The City and the Union Pacific Railroad (UPR) are working jointly to address these items. Staff is working on a remedial action plan for FRA approval. Once the action plan is approved, the City will need to secure appropriate permits from UPR prior to the start of any work. The Quiet Zone will be suspended until all corrective items are addressed.

POLICE EXPLORERS GRADUATE FROM LOS ANGELES SHERIFF EXPLORER ACADEMY



RIDE TO LIVE: MOTORCYCLE TRAINING COURSE

The Pomona Police Department received grant funding for the California of Traffic Safety (OTS) to promote motorcycle safety awareness with free, hands-on rider trainings led by local law enforcement. The \$24,000 grant will pay for a series of free motorcycle

3rd ANNUAL SEWER SPILL RESPONSE TRAINING

On Thursday, May 9th, the City of Pomona's Wastewater Division participated in the third annual Mutual Aid Partners Sewer Spill Response Training. Teams from the cities of Chino, Fontana, Ontario, as well as Cucamonga Valley Water District and Jurupa Community Services District joined Pomona for this event.

The City's Wastewater Operations staff participated in an all-day sewer spill-training event that included multiple sanitary sewer overflow simulations. Crews from the different cities and agencies collaborated as one team to manage each simulation, utilizing equipment from various teams. This training enhanced the City of Pomona's and Mutual Aid Partners' emergency response effectiveness, collaboration, and education.
