## **PUBLIC WORKS**

#### RESERVOIR STREET & WHITE AVENUE PAVEMENT REHABILITATION

Beginning this month, the City will be slurry sealing Reservoir Street from County Road to Holt Avenue, as well as White Avenue from Monterey Avenue to Arrow Highway (excluding the I-10 Caltrans area). Some preparation work has already begun, including crack sealing. Please avoid these active construction work areas, if possible. During construction, limited through traffic will be possible; however, please allow for more time when traveling these streets during this project. As always, please slow down and drive safely in construction zones. This nearly \$2,000,000 street rehabilitation project is anticipated to be completed by mid-August 2024.

#### STREET SWEEPING PROGRAM

Prior to the City's new exclusive franchise agreement with Athens that begin on July 1, 2023, Athens provided the City's street sweeping services under a separate contract. As you know, not all City streets are properly signed to notify residents of the day and time their street is scheduled to be swept.

With the beginning of the new exclusive franchise agreement last year, it was the Mayor and Council's direction that every street in the City be properly signed to provide for cleaner streets and community. Previously, residents would have to initiate a petition process for the City to consider installing street sweeping signs on their particular street. Now, residents will no longer have to submit a petition. To that end, Athens agreed to

provide funds to the City to purchase the necessary amount of signs and posts so that every street will be signed.

City Staff and Athens have been working together over the last few months on a strategy to provide an improved street sweeping program on every street. Updated street sweeping routes have been identified for every neighborhood and street in the City. The installation of new street sweeping signs has begun. Even though City Staff will be working six (6) days a week to install the signs, the installation of the new signs will not be completed until the end of this year. Athens has made robocalls and sent out mailers to advise residents about the installation of the signs. It is very important to note that the new, updated street sweeping program is not scheduled to begin until January 6, 2025.

We appreciate your patience and understanding as we work to improve our street sweeping program.

#### FOOTHILL GOLD LINE LIGHT RAIL PROJECT CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITY

As part of the 9.1-mile Foothill Gold Line light rail project, active train testing will begin to take place daily and nightly throughout the project area (between Barranca Ave. in the City of Glendora to past Garey Ave. in the City of Pomona). Testing began on Monday, July 8th and will continue through the end of 2024. Testing will occur Monday through Friday, specifically during shifts, as shown below. Regularly scheduled construction activities will also continue. Train testing, using an active train, will occur with the help of local police departments and the Los Angeles County Sheriff directing traffic at the grade crossings. To limit noise, the grade crossing bells will be disconnected as much as possible during this testing period, and the train operators will use their optional "quiet-zone" horns as much as possible. Please follow all safety instructions and be aware of active trains and dropping crossing gates at railroad crossings project-wide.

# Beginning Monday, July 8th, and continuing daily/nightly through December 31, 2024:

Testing will occur Monday – Friday as follows:

- **July 8th 12th**: Daily testing; 7:00 AM 4:00 PM (longer hours may be needed occasionally)
- **July 15th December 31st:** Nightly testing; 6:00 PM 4:30 AM (longer hours may be needed occasionally)


NOTE: Additional daytime/nighttime testing may occur, including on Saturdays and Sundays if needed.

#### TRAFFIC ADVISORIES

- Crossing gate arms will drop throughout the work shift when testing is taking place.
- Vehicular and pedestrian traffic will be stopped when gates are down; and resume as normal once gate arms are raised.

#### **REMINDERS:**

- > Never walk on the train tracks.
- > Never go around the lowered gates and follow all safety instructions.
- > Obey all warning signs and watch for trains from both directions.


# ASSEMBLYMEMBER FREDDIE RODRIGUEZ'S ANNUAL SUMMER COMMUNITY AWARDS AND BBQ

#### RIDE TO LIVE: MOTORCYCLE TRAINING COURSE

The Pomona Police Department received grant funding for the California of Traffic Safety (OTS) to promote motorcycle safety awareness with free, hands-on rider trainings led by local law enforcement. The \$24,000 grant will pay for a series of free motorcycle safety courses that allow riders to practice braking, turning, steering, entering traffic and other skills that help avoid crashes and improve rider safety on the road. The motorcycle training program will run through September 2024. The next free course is scheduled for July 20, 2024 at Veterans Park from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Please see flyer for registration details. Funding for this program is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

# CALIFORNIA PUBLIC UTILITES COMMISSION APPROVES NEW FLAT RATE PRICING FOR ALL SCE ENERGY CUSTOMERS

In May of 2024, the <u>California Public Utility</u> <u>Commission</u> (CPUC) approved the implementation of Income Graduated Fixed Charges, otherwise known as "Flat Rate Pricing," which brings a change in how utility costs are structured. The decision introduces a standardized monthly flat rate pricing that will affect all SCE customers, including those served by CalChoice's associated member agencies, starting in late 2025. The goal of this change is to establish a billing system that takes into account customers' income levels.



"The CPUC's approval of Flat Rate Pricing marks a significant shift in utility billing, emphasizing the need for open communication," said CalChoice Executive Director Jason Caudle. "Our associate members are instrumental in guiding our communities through these upcoming billing adjustments with innovative solutions."

The standard flat rate fixed charge for a typical customer, as established by the CPUC in consultation with California's three Investor-Owned Utilities, will be \$24.15 per month. However, customers enrolled in programs like the California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) and Family Electric Rate Assistance (FERA) are eligible for a discount. CARE customers will pay \$6 per month, while FERA customers will pay \$12 per month. Customers will receive an off-setting rate reduction of \$0.05 to \$0.07 per kilowatt-hour to what they currently pay each month for the transmission and distribution of their power. It is important to note that this action will not increase the rates community choice aggregation customers pay.

# STATE WATER BOARD ADOPTS "MAKING CONSERVATION A CALIFORNIA WAY OF LIFE" REGULATION

In 2018, the Legislature passed and the governor signed SB 606 and AB 1668, establishing a new framework for long-term water conservation and drought planning. In October 2022, the Department of Water Resources submitted technical reports, leading to the State Water Board's release of a Draft Regulatory Framework in March 2023. This framework initiated formal rulemaking in August 2023, with final adoption set for August 2024, incorporating the Association of California Water Agencies (ACWA) recommended amendments. Additionally, Governor Gavin Newsom signed SB 1157, reducing the standard for indoor residential water use to 47 gallons per capita daily (gpcd) by 2025 and 42 gpcd by 2030.

The State Water Resources Control Board has adopted the "Making Conservation a California Way of Life" regulation to achieve long-term water use efficiency and adapt to climate change by setting unique goals for each urban retail water supplier in California. Suppliers must comply with an urban water use objective, CII (commercial, industrial, and institutional) performance measures, and annual reporting. ACWA played a crucial role in shaping this regulation, securing amendments that adjust timelines, include alternative compliance pathways, modify compliance start dates, and revise processes for requesting variances, including a tree variance. Starting January 1, 2025, suppliers must annually calculate their urban water use objectives, with compliance required by January 1, 2027.



#### WATER VALVE REPLACEMENT

The Water Distribution team replaced a broken sixteen-inch water main valve near the intersection of Park Ave. and Alvarado St. This existing partially broken valve was nearly 90 years-old and still allowing water to flow. Within the working trench area, there were multiple public utilities, communications and water infrastructure too. The

team was able to address any construction concerns and complete the installation of the new valve.
