INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

APPLICATION UPGRADES

The IT Department performed various application upgrades in the past few weeks. Notable upgrades include deploying the latest endpoint protection to strengthen the City's cybersecurity posture, collaborating with Water Resources Department to upgrade meter-reading application to support modern mobile devices, and partnering with Community Services to update the <u>Recreation Website</u>. Periodic application updates and maintenance is a critical part of IT's responsibility to ensure all of our systems remain in support with our vendors and for other benefits including feature enhancements, bug fixes, and cybersecurity improvements.


LOOKING AHEAD

New and exciting initiatives are underway in IT! Continuing with IT's goal to modernize business practices, the City is migrating its collaboration software suite into cloud applications that will drastically improve how staff can share and edit documents with each other and with external partners. Additionally, IT is in the midst of assessing the City's Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system to determine whether a more modern system will benefit the City, e.g. reduce manual efforts, improve efficiency, empower staff with more features and accessible real-time reporting. An ERP system is a specialized application system that organizations rely upon to manage day-to-day activities such as budgeting, procurement, payroll, human resource management, amongst many others.

CIVIC ENGAGEMENT

On Thursday, July 18th, the City of Pomona Neighborhood Services Department hosted an immersion workshop for a group of Social Work Doctoral Students from California Baptist University (CBU). This interactive session was a platform to discuss students' role in local governance, city processes, and efforts to address social issues.

Mayor Tim Sandoval engaged with students and answered questions on local government structures, including the City Council, boards, and commissions, and their contribution to decisions on local matters. City Clerk Rosalia Butler provided an overview of the process of becoming an elected official or applying to serve on a board. City Manager Anita Gutierrez outlined current efforts to find innovative solutions to meet community needs.

CITY OF POMONA HOUSEHOLD UNIVERSAL GRANT (HUG) PROGRAM

Applications for the HUG Program closed on July 8th, and together we were able to received 1,214 applications.

HUG Program applicants can expect a seven-step timeline process. Most recently, the Program moved into its lottery and review period process where applicants are randomly selected, then reviewed. Applicants will be notified August 12, 2024 if they were selected for the Program. The first installment of grant funds will be issued August 26, 2024.

WATER RESOURCES

EXPANDING OUR FLEET

The City of Pomona's Wastewater Operation Division recently welcomed a valuable truck, the 2024 Vactor 2100i Combination Unit.

The addition of this new unit will ensure that the Wastewater Division is well equipped to maintain the 320 miles of the City's gravity sewer main located within the wastewater system. This unit will clean sewer mains, vacuum, hydro excavate, pothole while assisting other divisions, and provide emergency assistance as needed during wet weather events and respond to any emergency as needed.

Year to date, the Wastewater Division has achieved a feat with zero mainline sewer spills. This accomplishment reflects the commitment of the Water Resources Department's Wastewater Division.
