CALPERS ANNOUNCES PRELIMINARY 9.3% INVESTMENT RETURN FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023-24

California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS) recently announced they had a Preliminary 9.3% investment return for the Fiscal Year 2023-24, with total CalPERS assets valued at \$502.9 billion. This is positive news for agencies such as the City of Pomona who contribute to the pension fund. The preliminary investment return was higher than their target of 6.8% established by the CalPERS Board of Administration. This year's performance is better than the last two years due to a variety of economic and geopolitical factors. With the preliminary 9.3% return, CalPERS estimates that their pension fund is approximately 75% funded, meaning they have about 75% of the funds needed to pay for future retirement benefits. This performance will affect how much agencies contribute to CalPERS in future years. Since results are preliminary, CalPERS will review the portfolio's performance in the next few months to determine the final fiscal year returns. Once finalized, performance returns will be used to set contribution levels for cities in the 2026-27 fiscal year. As for the City of Pomona, the most recent actuarial valuation shows a 94% funded status, with assets valued at \$743 million. CalPERS' recent announcement suggests the City's annual payment may decrease the City's unfunded accrued liability payment to CalPERS in FY 2026-27.



FOOTHILL GOLD LINE TEMPORARY DAYTIME ACTIVE TRAIN TESTING IN POMONA

The ongoing active train testing for the Foothill Gold Line light rail project that began in July and has occurred mostly at night between San Dimas and Pomona will temporarily transition to daytime hours and will take place through the city of Glendora for the first time. During the three-day period of Thursday, August 1st, through Saturday, August 3rd, trains will run at higher speeds (up to 55 MPH) between San Dimas and Pomona and will also begin running through the City of Glendora (ranging in speed from 5 to 55 MPH). Active train testing is expected to move back to nighttime shifts beginning Monday night, August 5th, and continue throughout the four-city corridor mostly at night through the end of 2024 (as noted on the ongoing initial train testing notice). Local Police and County Sheriff support will continue during these operations to direct traffic at all grade crossings (see map below).

Beginning Thursday, August 1st through Saturday, August 3rd, testing in Pomona will occur Monday – Friday as follows:

• Thursday, August 1st (San Dimas, La Verne, & Pomona): High speed train testing between Gladstone St. and Garey Ave - Daytime testing hours: 7:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. (longer hours may be needed)

NOTE: Additional daytime/nighttime testing may occur, including on Saturdays and Sundays, if needed.

TRAFFIC ADVISORIES

- Trains will be running at high speeds (up to 55 MPH) during daytime hours.
- Crossing gate arms will drop throughout the work shift when testing is taking place.

• Vehicular and pedestrian traffic will be stopped when gates are down and resume as normal once gate arms are raised.

NOTE TO RESIDENTS

- Never walk on the train tracks or go around the lowered gates, and follow all safety instructions.
- Obey all warning signs and watch for trains from both directions.
