

NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES

PATHWAY HOME MOTEL-BASED INTERIM HOUSING IN POMONA

Pathway Home is an LA County Homeless Initiative-led encampment resolution program that is a critical component of the County's comprehensive response to the local emergency on homelessness adopted by the Board of Supervisors in 2023. By leveraging emergency powers and partnerships with local jurisdictions, such as the City of Pomona, **Pathway Home** is a full-circle solution that brings people off the streets into immediately available interim housing accompanied by a comprehensive suite of supportive services and, ultimately, into safe, permanent homes.

Pathway Home in the City of Pomona: On November 11, 2023, the County of Los Angeles, in a collaborative effort with the City of Pomona, Volunteers of America LA (VOALA), the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA), and the Department of Mental Health (DMH-HOME), and Department of Health Services – Housing for

Health (DHS-HFH), conducted a Pathway Home operation. This initial operation voluntarily relocated **44** individuals in **37** household configurations into motel-based interim housing within the City of Pomona, using Measure H funding for daily room rates, occupancy taxes, on-site supportive services, security, housing navigation, and rental subsidies. **56% of participants are seniors 50 years of age and older**.


Pathway Home is a one-stop-shop for enrolled participants to sign up for various essential services and supports that promote housing stability. These services include medical care and treatment, mental health care, substance use care, identification and birth records, benefits enrollment, and more. The program also offers life skills development, and community integration activities to ensure the holistic well-being of the participants.

The County covers the costs of this non-congregate, motel-based **interim housing** with on-site supportive services and security. The County is also funding housing navigation services, rental subsidies, benefits, and other resources and supportive services to enable Pathway Home participants to secure **permanent housing** and remain successfully housed. We are pleased to report that **three participants have been permanently housed to date**, a testament to the program's effectiveness and the dedication of all involved.

POMONA YOUTH FEST 2024

Pomona Police Department participated in the 3rd annual Pomona Youth Fest on August 2nd at the Millard Sheets Art Center at the Pomona Fairplex. This was a free music festival for teens aged 13-18 to enjoy live music from bands and solo artists. There were

also video game stations, different wellness activities, food and drinks. The Police Department's photo booth was enjoyed by many to capture the memories.



POMONA POLICE DEPARTMENT PARTNERS WITH POMONA HOUSING AUTHORITY

On July 30th, nine high utilizers signed paperwork to secure offers for permanent housing. These individuals will receive permanent housing in the next two months. The Police Department's Homeless Encampment Action Response Team (HEART), and Mental Health Evaluation Unit (MHU) partnered with the City of Pomona's Housing Authority, Department of Mental Health, and Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority to assist these high utilizers with long-term housing. This endeavor took over two months to complete. The Police Department played a vital role in not only identifying candidates for this project, but also in ensuring these unhoused residents were prepared for the transition. Our Department is committed to community outreach and we are proud to be a part of this collaborative effort with these great agencies.



PUBLIC WORKS LOPEZ URBAN FARM COMMUNITY COMPOST HUB

Residents can now obtain loose compost at no additional cost! The City of Pomona's exclusive franchise hauler, Athens Services, will provide the compost. Simply bring your own container or bag, and a shovel to the Lopez Urban Farm (Farm) located at 1034 W. Mission Blvd, Pomona, CA 91766. The compost will be located adjacent to the front parking lot. Fill your own container or bag with compost and use the compost in your home garden to build healthy, climateresilient soil and promote plant growth! Compost will be available year-round, as weather permits. The Farm is open daily: Tuesday – Friday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.; Wednesday from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m.; and Saturday and Sunday from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m.




