AFTER SCHOOL RECREATION IS BACK

After an exciting summer of specialty camps, the City's After School Recreation Program is back in action. The program is open to youth ages 7-17 at one site in each District. The program runs on Mondays, Tuesday, Thursdays, and Friday from 2:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. and on Wednesdays from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. at the following locations: Kiwanis, Ralph Welch, Philadelphia, Garfield, Westmont, and La Casita. La Casita received \$4M from Representative Norma Torres to expand and update the building to create a state-of-the-art recreation facility for teens featuring new computers, high-speed internet, and a dedicated study room. During La Casita's construction, the Willie White Community Center will serve as the new location for District 6. The official opening date will be announced soon. 2024 ANNUAL ACHIEVEMENT OF EXCELLENCE IN PROCUREMENT (AEP) The City of Pomona's Purchasing Division has been awarded the prestigious 2024 Annual Achievement of Excellence in Procurement® (AEP) from the National Procurement Institute, Inc. (NPI). The AEP Award is earned by agencies that demonstrate a commitment to procurement excellence. This annual program recognizes procurement organizations that embrace Innovation, Professionalism, Productivity, Leadership, and e-Procurement.

The AEP program encourages the development of excellence as well as continued organizational improvement to earn the award annually.

Applicants to the AEP award must submit an application showing they meet the criteria set by NPI. The criteria consist of date parameters that are scored and total 200 points. Agencies must obtain 100 points to receive the AEP award. The criteria is separated by categories related to procurement ethics, professional development, internal information on Purchasing policy and P-Card policy, continuous improvement with internal and external customers, organizational structure and e-procurement and automated technologies.

For 2024, there were 198 successful applicants including 72 cities, 49 counties, 25 special districts, 23 school districts, 16 higher education agencies, 5 state or provincial agencies and 8 others.

MAJOR WEEKEND CLOSURE ALERT: AVOID SOUTHBOUND SR71!

Due to the Riverside County Transportation Commission's 71/91 Interchange Reconstruction, the **southbound SR71 will be fully closed** Friday, August 16th from 10 p.m. to Monday, August 19th at 5 a.m. This closure affects the southbound 71 at Butterfield Ranch Rd. / Euclid Ave., including connectors to eastbound and westbound 91.

Detour Route:

- Take the Butterfield Ranch Rd. / Euclid Ave. exit.
- Detour northbound on Euclid Ave to eastbound or westbound 60.
- From 60, you can continue southbound on I-15 or 57.

Alternative Routes:

- Use southbound 57 or I-15 to avoid delays.

Debido a la Reconstrucción del Intercambio 71/91 de la Comisión de Transporte del Condado de Riverside, la 71 en dirección sur estará completamente cerrada desde el viernes 16 de agosto a las 10 p.m. hasta el lunes 19 de agosto a las 5 a.m. Este cierre afecta la 71 en dirección sur en Butterfield Ranch Rd./Euclid Ave., incluyendo los conectores hacia la 91 en dirección este y oeste.

FULL STREET CLOSURE OF FULTON RD. BETWEEN ARROW HWY. AND LA VERNE AVE.

As part of the 9.1-mile Foothill Gold Line light rail project, crews will complete the roadway, sidewalk, curb/gutter, and installation of traffic signals on Fulton Rd. and Arrow Hwy. in the City of Pomona. This work will take place on the southeast and southwest intersection corners of Fulton Rd. and Arrow Hwy. This work requires a full closure of Fulton Rd. between Arrow Hwy. and La Verne Ave. for five days. During the 5-day closure, thru traffic will not be accessible. Residential access will be maintained.

Beginning Monday, August 19th, and continuing through Friday, August 23rd, Fulton Rd. will be fully closed to all through traffic (vehicular and pedestrian) between Arrow Hwy. and La Verne Ave. 24 hours a day. Arrow Hwy. (north of the closure) and La Verne Ave. (south of the closure) will remain open and accessible by way of detour routes, see map below.

- Daily Work Hours: 7:00 AM 8:00 PM. Overnight work may also be required.
- Fulton Rd. will be fully closed to vehicular and pedestrian traffic south of Arrow Hwy.
- Access to homes within the closure area north of La Verne Ave. and south of Arrow Hwy. will be maintained at all times.
- Noise from construction equipment will be produced near the active work zones.
- Bus stops may be temporarily relocated.

Simply bring your own container or bag, and a shovel to the Lopez Urban Farm (Farm) located at 1034 W. Mission Blvd, Pomona, CA 91766. The compost will be located adjacent to the front parking lot. Fill your own container or bag with compost and use the compost in your home garden to build healthy, climateresilient soil and promote plant growth! Compost will be available year-round, as weather permits. The Farm is open daily: Tuesday – Friday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.; Wednesday from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m.; and Saturday and Sunday from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m.
