




POLICE

PUBLIC WORKS

SR-71 FREEWAY CONNECTOR AND ON-RAMP CLOSURES SCHEDULED IN POMONA

POMONA – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) announced various closures between State Route 71 (SR-71) and State Route 60 (SR-60) from September 9-13, for road repair work. EXTENDED CLOSURE – Rio Rancho on-ramp to Northbound SR-71 from June 10, 2024 through September 30, 2024 for ramp realignment. Detours will be posted.

The closures are as follows and are subject to change:

Friday, September 13

- Rio Rancho Rd. on-ramp to Eastbound SR-60, closed from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
- Westbound SR-60 connector to Northbound SR-71, closed from 7:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.
- Westbound SR-60 connector to Northbound/Southbound SR-71, closed from 8:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m.

Residents and businesses located near the freeway are advised to anticipate noise and vibrations associated with construction activities.

Motorists should expect delays and are strongly advised to avoid the area and use alternate routes. Additionally, motorists can check traffic conditions before they leave by visiting the Caltrans Quickmap (quickmap.dot.ca.gov).

Caltrans reminds motorists to "Be Work Zone Alert" and "Slow for the Cone Zone."

COMMNITY CLEAN-UP EVENT – SEPTEMBER 21, 2024

The Public Works Department is pleased to announce the third community clean-up event hosted by Athens. The event will take place on Saturday, September 21, 2024 from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. at Palomares Park, located at 499 E. Arrow Hwy. Residents will be allowed to dispose of household bulky items, carpet, electronic waste, broken furniture, mattresses, refrigerators, textiles, and yard waste.

Additionally, as provided by CalRecycle, participants will also be allowed to dispose of used motor oil and filters.

This collection event is exclusive to Pomona residents. Participants are required to bring proof of Pomona residency by providing a CA ID and/or Utility Bill.





FOOTHILL GOLD LINE UPDATE

With just over four months remaining before the Glendora to Pomona project will reach substantial completion, Foothill Gold Line crews continue to conduct active train testing throughout the corridor to ensure all elements of the new light rail system work as intended while simultaneously completing the remaining construction activities, including work at the four new stations. Overall, major construction of the Glendora to Pomona project is now approximately 90% complete and remains on time and on budget.

The Pomona to Montclair project will soon reach its next milestone with the release of the Request for Proposal (RFP) to the Kiewit design-build team in September. This follows last month's announcement by Governor Newsom and CalSTA on the release of the SB125 funds to be used for transit capital projects statewide. LA Metro is projected to receive \$1 billion of those funds, and the Metro board last month once again reaffirmed their commitment to allocate \$798 million of the SB125 funds to complete the LA County portion of the final 3.2-mile, two-station Pomona to Montclair segment (that includes stations in Claremont and Montclair).


Four New Stations

The four new light rail stations are 80% complete overall. All station canopies have been installed, and work continues on the station platforms and associated parking facilities. Working out of their studios and fabrication facilities, each station's artist/artist team continues to bring their art pieces to reality as they prepare them for installation.

At the future Pomona station, Foothill Gold Line crews are installing decorative roof elements atop the station's canopy structures. Their crews have completed installation of the metal roof atop the main boarding canopy, and are now installing the diamond-shaped shingles on top. The future Pomona station also features three ticketing areas (one at the west entrance to the platform, and two at the east entrance). Crews are currently installing the decorative glass panels atop the three canopies (photo below, left), which feature citrus-inspired patterns designed by Alignment artist Christie Beniston. In addition, as seen in the photo below (right), crews are also installing the tactile pavers.

Just south of the future station, crews continue to build the parking area for the Pomona North Metrolink station. Crews have already completed the necessary work at the easternmost and center sections of the parking lot to allow them to reopen for use and are now rebuilding the westernmost section. The westernmost section, including the entrance to the lot from Fulton Rd., will remain fully closed through September 30.





Sound Wall Installation

Foothill Gold Line crews are nearing the completion of installing approximately 28,000 linear feet of decorative sound walls from Glendora to Pomona. The sound walls will help reduce noise from the light rail trains for adjacent homes and noise sensitive neighbors. The sound wall panels were fabricated locally before being delivered for installation.



Grade Crossing Improvements

Restriping is complete on White Ave. in the City of La Verne, and the corners of Fulton Road/Arrow Hwy have reopened. Crews continue to implement intermittent lane closures in Pomona at the Garey Ave. crossing and at Garey Ave./Grevillia Ave.

Pomona to Montclair Segment Update

The approximately 15-month procurement process that began in March 2024 to hire the design-builder for the 3.2-mile, two-station Pomona to Montclair project will soon reach its next milestone with the release of the Request for Proposal (RFP) to the Kiewit design-build team in September. This follows the Foothill Gold Line board's action at

their July meeting to approve short-listing the Kiewit design-build team, after several evaluation committees reviewed the team's statement of qualifications submittal and deemed the team qualified on all evaluation categories.

Once funding is fully in place and a design-build team is hired, the shovel-ready Pomona to Montclair segment will take approximately five years to complete.

WATER RESOURCES

RIBBON-CUTTING CEREMONY AT THE HISTORIC STABLES

On September 12, 2024, the City hosted a ribbon cutting ceremony for the Water Resources Department (WRD) Yard buildings at 752 W. Commercial Street. Elected officials, City representatives, Staff, residents, and regional government members attended the event. Designed by Sillman Architects and constructed by Kemp Bros. Construction, Inc. the project included administration building, warehouse, and building representing the historic City Stables. The City salvaged as much material as possible from the original City Stables and incorporated it into the new building.

The new site includes three buildings—the warehouse, administrative offices, and stables replica building cover a total of over 26,000 square feet. This site will be used for operations, management, and for administrative City staff. The public will be able to enter the new site through the stables building for conducting business, land development, and all associated WRD activities. Controlled public access will be available during regular business hours from Monday through Thursday 7:00 am to 5:00 pm.



PHASE #3: HYDRATION STATION UPGRADES

On February 26, 2024, the City Council awarded a contract to Oppenheimer National to upgrade non-functioning drinking fountains and to bring existing drinking fountains up to Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards. The project scope included the replacement of 10 drinking fountains and relocating two. Work for the "Hydration Station Upgrades" Phase 3 project is now complete. All completed phases are identified in the map below. The Phase 3 fountain locations are identified in the green circled areas on the map.
