
POLICE DEPARTMENT APP UPGRADES

POMONA POLICE RECEIVES CITY COUNCIL PROCLAMATION

The Mayor and City Councilmembers presented CSO Louie, Facility K9 Tuckerman, and

Corporal Hayward with a Proclamation recognizing the month of September 2024 as National Service Dog Month in the City of Pomona. National Service Dog Month aims to educate our community about the benefits of service dogs and the laws protecting them. In the United States, 64 million adults and children have a disability and only 16,000 service dogs from accredited exist training programs



nationwide, and the need is growing. Tuckerman came to us from Canine Companions, which is a nonprofit organization that enhances the lives of people with disabilities by providing expertly trained service dogs and ongoing support to ensure quality

partnerships. The Pomona Police Department is proud to deploy K9 Tuckerman, who brings comfort and support to our department and community members.

PUBLIC WORKS

ONE-DAY FULL STREET CLOSURES ON FULTON ROAD

As part of the 9.1-mile Foothill Gold Line light rail project, crews will complete the installation of traffic signals on Fulton Rd. and Arrow Hwy. in the cities of La Verne and Pomona. This work will take place on all four intersection corners of Fulton Rd. and Arrow Hwy. This work will require one-day full closures of different segments of Fulton Rd. at different times. During the one-day closures, through traffic will not be accessible, however, residential access will be maintained.

On Tuesday, September 24th, Fulton Rd. will be fully closed to all through traffic (vehicular and pedestrian) between Arrow Hwy. and 1st St. Arrow Hwy. (south of the closure) and 1st St. (north of the closure) will remain open and accessible.

On Wednesday, September 25th, Fulton Rd. will be fully closed to all through traffic (vehicular and pedestrian) between Arrow Hwy. and La Verne Ave. Arrow Hwy. (north of the closure) and La Verne Ave. (south of the closure) will remain open and accessible by way of detour routes.

Detour routes are shown below.

- Daily Work Hours: 7:00 a.m. 8:00 p.m. NOTE: Longer work hours may be required.
- Fulton Rd. will be fully closed to vehicular and pedestrian traffic north of Arrow Hwy.
- Access to homes within the closure area north of Arrow Hwy. and south of 1st St. will be maintained at all times.
- Access to homes within the closure area north of La Verne Ave. and south of Arrow Hwy. will be maintained at all times.
- Noise from construction equipment will be produced near the active work zones.

PLAN YOUR ROUTE AND BE PREPARED

A detour route will be in place during the closure and signage will be posted to direct motorists and pedestrians, as well as Metrolink customers:

- \circ Fulton Rd. will be fully closed to all through traffic at Arrow Hwy between Arrow Hwy and 1st St.
- o Garey Ave. (northbound and southbound) will serve as the main detour route
- o Arrow Hwy. (eastbound and westbound) will remain open to all traffic


o Bonita Ave. (eastbound and westbound) will remain open to all traffic

WEST VALLEY CONNECTOR (WVC) PROJECT

Managed and funded by the San Bernardino County Transportation Authority (SBCTA), the West Valley Connector (WVC) Project will be a 100% zero-emission Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) system running between the Pomona Transit Center and the Rancho Cucamonga Metrolink Station.

In the coming weeks, construction of a total of 21 new BRT stations will begin in the cities of Pomona, Montclair, and Rancho Cucamonga slated to start in the coming weeks. This WVC Project will provide an improved transit connection to Downtown Pomona and from Pomona to Ontario International Airport, and help build transit connectivity to multiple major activity centers along the route.

The WVC Project is anticipated to be complete in spring 2026, with BRT service to be provided by Omnitrans expected to start shortly thereafter. In mid-September, construction crews will begin performing pre-construction activities to construct bus stations on Holt Avenue at Towne Avenue and at Clark Avenue in the City of Pomona.

This work will require intermittent daytime lane closures for approximately one week to safely perform the construction work. Once pre-construction activities are complete, crews will begin full-time outside lane closures at the future station locations for approximately six weeks. At least one lane will be open to traffic at all times.

Construction activities may include demolition of the current stations, roadway demolition, utility relocation, and construction of bus pads in preparation of the new stations. Traffic delays are expected. Motorists are encouraged to plan ahead, allow extra time to reach their destinations, or use alternate routes if possible. SR-71 EXPRESSWAY TO FREEWAY - CONNECTOR AND ON-RAMP CLOSURES SCHEDULED IN POMONA

POMONA – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) announces various closures between State Route 71 (SR-71) and State Route 60 (SR-60) on Monday, September 16th through Friday, September 20th for road repair work.

EXTENDED CLOSURE – Rio Rancho on-ramp to Northbound SR-71 from June 10, 2024 through September 30, 2024 for ramp realignment. Detours will be posted.


