




POLICE

RIDE TO LIVE: MOTORCYCLE TRAINING COURSE

The Pomona Police Department received grant funding for the California of Traffic Safety (OTS) to promote motorcycle safety awareness with free, hands-on rider training led by local law enforcement. The \$24,000 grant will pay for a series of free motorcycle safety courses that allow riders to practice braking, turning, steering, entering traffic, and other skills that help avoid crashes and improve rider safety on the road. The next free course is scheduled for September 28, 2024 at Veterans Park at 8:00 am. Please see the flyer for registration details. Funding for this program is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.



COPS 4 KIDS COMMUNITY EVENT

On Saturday, September 21, 2024 Pomona Resource Officers and Junior Cadets of the Cops 4 Kids program participated in their first community event of the session. The Junior Cadets of Westmont Elementary School volunteered their time to give their school campus a deep clean. Cops 4 Kids is a Police Department program conducted at various elementary schools within our City for students ages 9-13. It consists of a 10-week program in which officers from our department work with students to build



confidence, encourage positive life choices, and promote the importance of self-discipline, and leadership. Junior Cadets are encouraged to give back to their community by participating in this event. This is just one opportunity for our Junior Cadets to play a constructive role and show respect for their community.

PUBLIC WORKS

SUCCESSFUL COMMUNITY CLEAN-UP EVENT

The third Community Clean-up Event of the year was held on Saturday, September 21, 2024, from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. at Palomares Park. Public Works and Athens team members were on hand to assist with the flow of vehicles, and to answer questions on source separation and recycling.

Those who attended the event dropped off a variety of bulky items, e-waste, paper for shredding, used oil and filters, green waste, and large volumes of materials.


Staff reported 556 vehicles dropped off a total of 72.19 tons of refuse. Athens provided 19 roll-off containers and three (3) trash trucks. The event was a success!



FOOTHILL GOLD LINE POMONA NORTH - TEMPORARY PARKING LOT CHANGES

Beginning Tuesday, October 1 through Tuesday, December 31, 2024, the Foothill Gold Line light rail construction crews will continue rebuilding the Pomona North Metrolink parking area. The western portion of the parking lot and the Fulton Rd. entrance have reopened, and crews will now close the eastern section of the parking lot, as well as the Santa Fe St. entrance to complete work in those areas. The closure will temporarily eliminate vehicular access and parking on the east side. The western area of the parking lot will be open and accessible from Fulton Rd. only, providing approximately 152 standard spaces and six (6) ADA-accessible spaces. There will be no vehicular access allowed through the Santa Fe St. entrance or the closed parking area, but pedestrian access via Santa Fe St. will be maintained. Use Fulton Rd. for all vehicular and Metrolink parking and ticketing access.

- Work Hours: 7:00 AM 8:00 PM, Monday thru Saturday. NOTE: Occasional longer work hours and construction on Sundays may be performed during the period.
- Construction activities will continue to take place within the closed parking area shown below in red on the eastern side of the Metrolink parking lot. Parking will open and available on the western side of the lot, accessible from Fulton Rd. only.
- Vehicles accessing the Pomona North station and parking must use the <u>Fulton Rd.</u> entrance, which is ONLY accessible from northbound Fulton Rd. (the Fulton Rd. entrance is right in/right out only). Pedestrian access will remain available at both entrances, Fulton Rd. and Santa Fe St.
- Typical noise from construction equipment will be produced near the active work zones, including the use of trucks and light plants. Large equipment and deliveries will be coming and going from the work zones regularly.
- Please obey all posted construction signs and do not enter the construction zone.
 - Construction schedules are subject to change for various reasons, including, but not limited to, weather conditions and unforeseen delays.



FREE COMPOST GIVEAWAY EVENT – OCTOBER 12, 2024

The Public Works Department is pleased to announce an upcoming <u>free compost</u> giveaway event to be held on Saturday, October 12, 2024 from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. This event will be hosted by Athens Services, the City's exclusive franchise solid waste hauler.

This self-serve event will take place at Palomares Park located at 499 E. Arrow Highway. Residents are encouraged to bring durable containers, shovels, and gloves. The giveaway is on a first-come, first-serve basis.
