#### **THE GREAT SHAKEOUT!**

On October 17th, the City proudly participated The in Great ShakeOut, a global earthquake preparedness drill designed to help individuals and organizations practice effective safe and responses to seismic events. This annual event underscores the importance of readiness, ensuring that our city remains prepared to protect employees, residents, and visitors in the event of earthquake.

At 10:17 a.m., all City employees participated by performing the essential "Drop, Cover, and Hold On" technique. This simple but lifesaving action prepares individuals to respond quickly and safely during a sudden quake.

Here's how Pomona engaged in the 2024 Great ShakeOut:









- **Citywide Drill Participation:** Departments across the City took part in the coordinated drill to ensure everyone understands proper emergency procedures.
- **Facility Inspections:** The Building and Safety Division conducted walkthroughs of City facilities to assess and identify potential hazards of City facilities.
- Communication System Testing: We tested internal communication systems.
- Employee Training & Preparedness Workshops: Last month, floor wardens received specialized training on evacuation protocols and shelter-in-place procedures, equipping them to lead during emergencies.

The Great ShakeOut serves as a critical reminder that preparedness is key to minimizing risks during a disaster. Earthquakes strike without warning, and these drills help Pomona employees practice swift, coordinated responses.

We encourage all employees to continue reviewing their emergency plans at work and at home, making sure kits are stocked, and staying informed through emergency alerts. Preparedness is a shared responsibility, and our actions today help build a safer tomorrow for the entire Pomona community.

# LEAD HAZARD REDUCTION GRANT AND HEALTHY HOMES SUPPLEMENT AWARD


Great news! The City of Pomona will be receiving \$4,947,433 in Lead Based Paint Hazard Control grant program funds from the Department of Housing and Urban Development. The funds will be used to provide safer homes for low and very low-income families by addressing lead based paint and other housing-related hazards in the City. Specifically, the grant will eliminate lead based paint hazards in 105 owner- and renter-occupied housing units. Around \$730,000 of the grant amount will be used to remove trip and fall, fire, pest, plumbing, lack of ventilation and other housing hazards in 45 housing units.

Other awardees in California are Counties of Los Angeles and Fresno.

## **PUBLIC WORKS**

SB 1383: COMPOST GOALS AND MULCHING THE PATH TO A GREENER FUTURE!

One of the lesser-known requirements of SB 1383, California's statewide food waste reduction and edible food recovery law, is that the City must purchase and distribute compost and mulch to promote the use of recycled products. Compost is made from recycled food and green waste, while mulch can be made from recycled landscaping debris and wood products.

To meet SB 1383 procurement targets, the City has partnered with Athens Services to increase the use of compost and mulch in local projects. This year, the City will utilize 270 tons of compost and 1,030 tons of mulch for parks and street projects. Additionally, 160 tons of compost have been provided to Pomona residents at local parks and community gardens.




## WATER RESOURCES

#### NORTH GAREY AVENUE VAULT REPAIR

This week, the Gold Line Authority finished construction to repair an existing water vault on north Garey Avenue south of the railroad tracks. Kiewit contractor damaged the vault lid during the construction of the Metro Gold Line's Phase 2B railroad extension; the vault contains water valves for the City's system. A steel door will replace the temporary door replacement material. All construction work will be completed at this location by October 25, 2024.









## 17th ANNUAL SAN ANTONIO CANYON WATERSHED CLEAN-UP

The City of Pomona, in collaboration with the City of Upland and the San Antonio Water Company, proudly hosted the 17th Annual San Antonio Canyon Watershed Clean-Up

Day on Saturday, October 12<sup>th</sup>. This year's event drew an impressive turnout, with over 60 volunteers dedicated to improving their local environment.

Among the participants were local Boy Scout and Girl Scout troops, showcasing the importance of community involvement in environmental stewardship at a young age. Additionally, members of the environmental club from Mt. SAC joined the effort, bringing valuable knowledge about conservation practices.

Volunteers gathered early in the morning with gloves and trash bags to clean trails and waterways, removing litter that could harm



wildlife and pollute the watershed. This effort is essential for maintaining clean natural spaces and building community.

By protecting the San Antonio Canyon watershed, which supplies drinking water to Pomona residents through the Pedley Filter Plant, volunteers help ensure clean water for the community now and for future generations.
