PUBLIC WORKS

DOWNTOWN POMONA QUIET ZONE REINSTATED

During an inspection in May 2024, the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) identified a list of corrective items (signage, striping, and median islands) to be addressed as part of the requirements to preserve the Quiet Zone designation through Downtown Pomona. Until these corrective items were addressed, the FRA suspended the Quiet Zone designation. As a result, you have been hearing the blowing of the train horns more frequently.

The City and the Union Pacific Railroad (UPR) worked jointly to address these items. City Staff worked on a remedial action plan for FRA approval, and secured the appropriate permits from UPR prior to the start of any work.

We are happy to report that earlier this week, the FRA approved the work and authorized the reinstatement of the Quiet Zone. The Quiet Zone should be reinstated within the next 72 hours.

FOOTHILL GOLD LINE CONSTRUCTION ALERT - DAYTIME FREIGHT TRAIN TESTING IN POMONA

Active train testing of the freight system will take place on two Saturdays, running through four cities: Glendora, San Dimas, La Verne, and Pomona. During the two separate days (two Saturdays over the course of two consecutive weekends), freight trains will run at their full speed of 40 MPH. Local Police and County Sheriff support will be in place to direct traffic at all grade crossings (see map below).

Active Freight Train Testing will occur during daytime hours on Saturday, November 2, 2024 as follows:


• <u>Saturday, November 2 (San Dimas, La Verne, and Pomona):</u> High speed train testing (40 MPH) between Eucla Ave. and Cambridge Ave. Daytime testing hours: 8:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. (longer hours may be needed).

The freight train will be running at high speeds (40 MPH) during the daytime hours listed above.

- Crossing gate arms will drop throughout the work shift when testing is taking place.
- Vehicular and pedestrian traffic will be stopped when gates are down and resume as normal once gate arms are raised.

Residents should never walk on the train tracks or go around the lowered gates. Always follow all safety instructions, obey all warning signs, and watch for trains from both directions.
