OUTDOOR & ACTIVE'S NATURE CLUB

The Pomona Pathfinders kicked off their first "Wondering Wednesday," an engaging learning experience where participants had the chance to connect with nature through the expertise of a Chino Hills State Park Ranger. STATE OF EARLY CHILDHOOD SUMMIT

On November 7th the City hosted the "State of Early Childhood Summit: Pomona's Investment in the Early Childhood Ecosystem (PIECE)" at the Sheraton Fairplex Suites & Conference Center with 135 stakeholders in attendance.

The purpose of the Summit was for attendees to walk with away stronger understanding around the Early Childhood work currently underway in Pomona, including an update of the Conrad N. Hilton Planning Grant for 0-3. The Summit also focused on building deeper engagement with



government agencies, educational institutions, health providers, non-profits and other key stakeholders. It was an opportunity to share data that has been collected through authentic community engagement. With the ultimate goal of elevating and incorporating Pomona families' experiences and voices in to the design of future efforts. The in-person event brought together experts in early childhood ecosystems to share their knowledge and experiences. Summit presenters included: UCLA, The Conrad N. Hilton Foundation, a panel discussion on the Pomona HUG Pilot Program, Pomona's Poet Laureate, a Pomona Parent and keynote speaker Miguel Santana.

PUBLIC WORKS

WEST VALLEY CONNECTOR (WVC) PROJECT

Managed and funded by the San Bernardino County Transportation Authority (SBCTA), the West Valley Connector (WVC) Project will be a 100% zero-emission Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) system running between the Pomona Transit Center and the Rancho Cucamonga Metrolink Station.

Earlier this month. construction crews will begin performing preconstruction activities to construct bus stations on Holt Avenue at Garey Avenue, Towne Avenue, Clark Avenue and Indian Hill Boulevard in the City of Pomona. This work will require full-time outside lane closures at future station the




locations for approximately six weeks at each location. At least one lane will be open to traffic at all times.

Construction activities will include demolition of the current stations, roadway demolition, utility relocation, and construction of bus pads in preparation of the new stations. Traffic delays are expected. Motorists are encouraged to plan ahead, allow extra time to reach their destinations, or use alternate routes, if possible. CIVIC CENTER PLAZA - NEW PLAYGROUND AND AMENITIES

This highly anticipated project consists of a new destination playground that will feature an all-inclusive play environment for the entire City to enjoy. There will be a large all-abilities playground, a restroom building, a new maintenance and control building, shaded seating and picnic opportunities, walkway lighting, and irrigation improvements. The historic Civic Center Plaza Fountain will be renovated and brought back to its former glory in operation.

Construction will start this month, and be completed by the end of 2025.



REMINDER TO FOLLOW BIKE LANE RULES AND REGULATIONS

According to the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV), each year in California, over 100 bicyclists are killed, and over 10,000 are injured in collisions on our roads. With more new bike lane facilities being implemented throughout the City, here are some guidelines (provided by DMV and Pomona Police Department) to follow when riding a bike in traffic or driving in areas where bicyclists are present:

For Bicyclists:

- At night, use lights and reflectors (at minimum, a front white light with a visible distance of 300 ft. and a rear red reflector with a visible distance of 500 ft.)
- **Always wear a properly secured helmet.** Helmets lower the risk of a serious head injury in the event of a collision.
- Bicyclists must travel in the same direction as traffic.
- Yield to pedestrians, just as a driver would. Pedestrians have the right-ofway within designated crosswalks or unmarked crosswalks at intersections.
- Use hand signals before making turns or changing lanes.
 - o Look behind you, over your left shoulder, and then extend your left arm out to signal a left turn.
 - o Hold your left arm up with your elbow bent to signal a right turn.
 - o To signal to slow or stop, extend your left arm down.
 - o To signal that you are slowing or stopping, extend your left arm down.



For Drivers:

- **Look carefully** for bicyclists and pedestrians before making a turn or opening a car door near streets or bike paths.
- **Be patient when traveling behind a bicyclist**. Maintain at minimum three feet of space when passing or overtaking a bicyclist.
- **Slow down and follow the speed limit**. Be careful traveling through intersections.
- Never drive distracted or impaired.

WATER RESOURCES

STORMWATER PERMIT RENEWAL FOR SANTA ANA WATERSHED

The Santa Ana Water Board is the state's entity responsible for water quality in the Santa Ana River Basin. The eastern portion of Pomona drains to the Santa Ana River. Parts of the Santa Ana River has high levels of bacteria, posing a risk to recreational users. The Santa Ana Water Board has set safe limits for bacteria in the river and requirements on cities to identify and reduce sources of bacteria to meet the limits. The Santa Ana Water Board issued a permit to regulate bacteria discharged from the cities of Pomona and Claremont. Other cities have a separate permit.

The Santa Ana Water Board is now renewing the permits according to state and federal law. The Santa Ana Water Board has created a mailing list exclusively for Pomona and Claremont's permit to keep interested parties informed. By signing up, you will receive information on the permit's progress, public workshops, and opportunities to provide
